The physician locked the money in a drawer and the sick looked on "Well I'm ready to be examined he said at length.

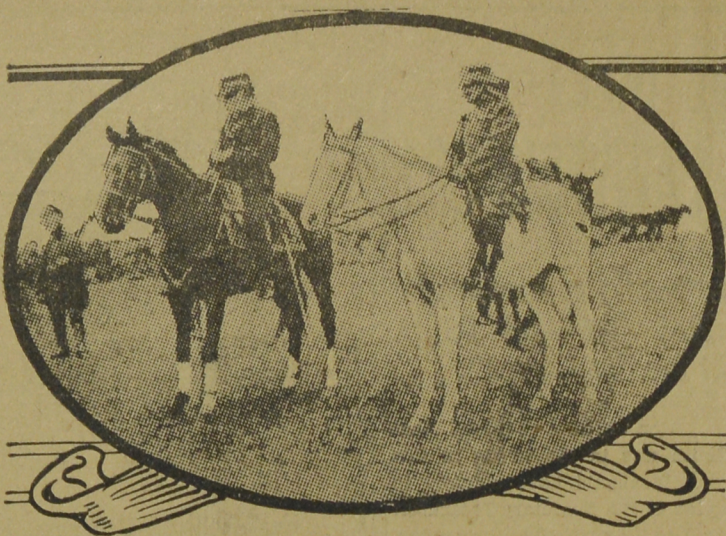
"I don't think it necessary," replied the screwed physician "there is no need to do it again keep on taking the same medicine. Good-day sir.

All employers of labor in said district willing to give preference to returned disabled soldiers as employees, and all returned discharged soldiers wanting employment residing therein are requested to notify the secretary

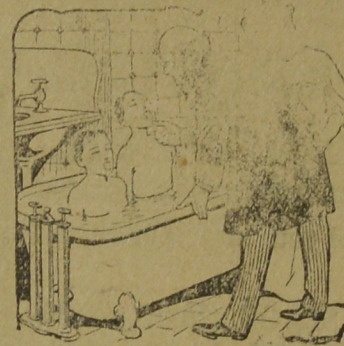

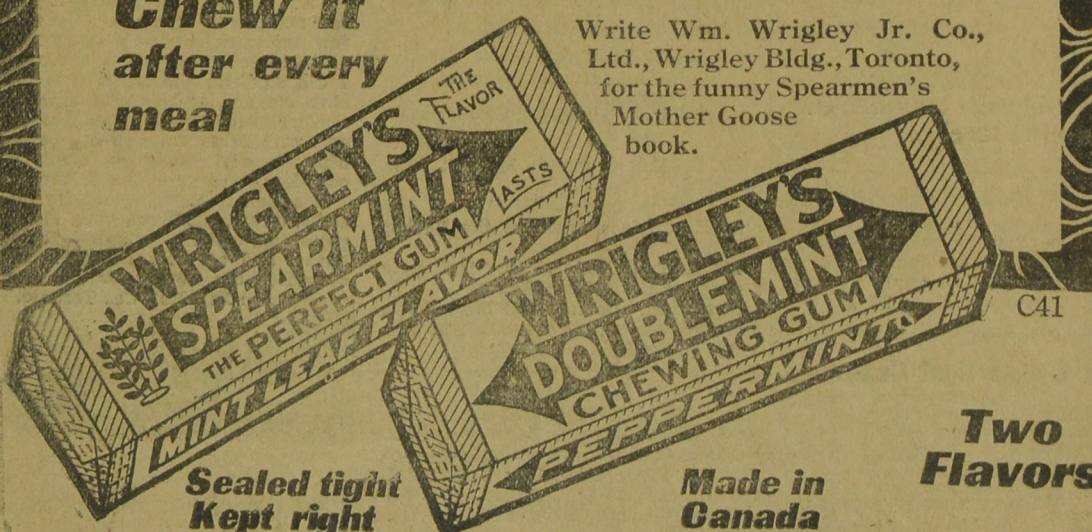
