BEETS-EARLY AND

LATE VARITIES

Beets are companion or succession erops. They are easy to raise. The land must be well mulched to preserve noisture and kept free from weeds.

There are two varieties, the short eason turnip type, and the main sea The former is th favorite garden crop. They mature in two or three months and may often b used in six weeks after sowing.

For fall use the turnip beet may b sown in July or August, or in som places as late as September. The seed crop may be sown as soon as the ground is in a workable shape. Repeat sowings at intervals extending over ;

The long or blood beets are usually sown in early May, and they occupy he ground during the entire season. Early beets may be sown between rows of late maturing plants just as the ealry radish is sown.
