## LIEUT. FITTON HERE.

Lieut. Richard Fitton is in the city today. Lieut. Fitton has been visiting his home in Margerville. He expects to leave within a few days for Ottawa to take the position of captain and adjutant with the 230th Battalion, being raised there. Lieut. Fitton left here in August, 1914, with the first draft from the 71st York Regt. and afterward became quartermaster sergeant of the 12th Battalion. Later he was given a commission in England and became an instructor to the Canadian forces and also accompanied drafts to the base in France.

MAN GIVES LIFE  
ON WESTERN FRONT

John H. Brooks Who Was Here With R. C. R., Died of Wounds-- Had Rejoined R. C. R. at Halifax.

Private John Henry Brooks, who appears in the casualty list issued last night as having died of wounds received while fighting in France with the Canadian troops, formerly lived in Fredericton. He was here for several years as a member of P. Company, Royal Canadian Regiment, and has many acquaintances in Fredericton and vicinity.

Private Brooks, during a part of the time he was here, was batman to Capt. M. E. Roscoe. When a party was organized here in the summer of 1914, to go to Port Nelson, Hudson Bay, to work on the construction of harbor works, he went with it, remaining at Port Nelson for some months. In the following winter he rejoined the Royal Canadian Regiment Depot at Halifax and from there went to England with the regiment when it returned from Bermuda.

Brooks was a man of good physique and had served in the Imperial Army before coming to Canada. He appeared in the casualty list some days ago as wounded.

## LATE MRS. JOHN FOWLER.

Mrs. John Fowler passed away on Wednesday at her home at Day's Landing. The remains were brought here for interment. The funeral took place this afternoon, Capt. Jondie of the Salvation Army, officiating. Interment was made at the Rural cemetery. Two sisters and one brother survive.

OBSTRUCTION AND  
INTERFERENCE CHARGED BY POLICEMAN

John Duncan Arrested as Sequel of Yesterday's Scott Act Raid-- Accused Admitted to Bail This Morning.

As a sequel to the Scott Act raid at Long's Hotel yesterday, John Duncan appeared in the police court this morning on the charge of resisting and obstructing a policeman in the discharge of his duty. The case will be contested. Mr. P. J. Hughes appeared this morning as counsel for the accused. The latter, who had been arrested on a warrant, was admitted to bail for two hundred dollars, the bondsman being his counsel and the proprietor of Long's Hotel. The case will be continued Friday, May 26.

The alleged offense took place in the stable of the hotel when Policemen Marshall and Hughes included that part of the premises in the search for liquor under a Canada Temperance Act warrant. Policeman Marshall laid the information against the accused, stating that he had been interfered with while trying to search the stable.

It was stated yesterday that Duncan would make a counter-charge of assault against Policeman Marshall. No such charge had been made, however, up to noon today.

## PRISONER RECAPTURED.

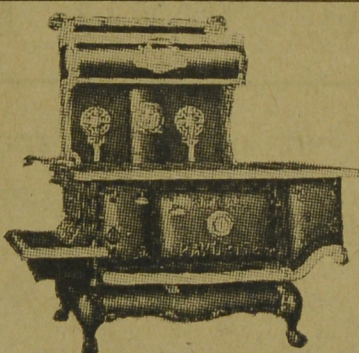

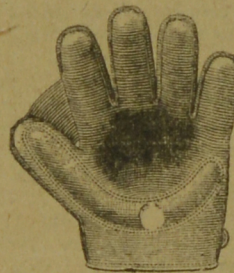
