Villa Bandits Charge a Train

El Paso, Texas, Nov. 4.—"Death to Americans" was the cry of the Villa bandits who charged down from the foothills of Aguna, upon the Mexican Central passenger train Monday night, Dr. Shaffner, a German physician, who was a passenger on the looted train, declared upon his arrival here last night from Chihuahua City.

Dr. Shaffner was told by one of the Villa chiefs in command of the bandits that Villa has captured Santa Rosalia, Jimenez, and would take Chihuahua City within ten days after the railway to Jaurez has been destroyed.

Shaffner, who had practised medicine in Chihuahua for many years, recognized some of the bandits as former patients and called them by name after he had established his identity as a German subject.

"I am sure I would have been killed had I not been recognized as the German doctor who had lived in Chihuahua City so long," he added.

"The bandits came through the train crying 'death to Americans,' and using the vilest oaths in reference to the 'gringos.'"

New York, Nov. 4.—No mail from England or France has been delivered here this week owing to it having been placed on board the Cunard line steamship Carpathia, one of the slowest ships in the Atlantic passenger service. The Carpathia left Liverpool on Oct. 25, and is due here today.

Melbourne, Australia, via London, Nov. 4.—While returns from the conscription referendum are still incomplete, the majority in opposition to the proposition is being reduced daily.

Birmingham, Ala., Nov. 4.—More than sixty men are entombed in the Bessie Mines this morning as the result of an explosion about 4 o'clock.

The mines are twenty miles west of this city.

SHIPBUILDING TO BE AIDED BY GOVERNMENT

Ottawa, Nov. 3.—As a measure of government encouragement for shipbuilding in Canada, an order-in-council has been passed granting 99 per cent. drawback of customs duties paid on materials used in the original construction of ships measuring over 500 tons gross tonnage built in Canada, to be exported for outside registry. The vessels must be constructed so as to obtain a registry in Lloyds' satisfactory to the Minister of Customs, and their export on completion must in each case be authorized by order-in-council.

A considerable number of vessels on foreign order are now being built in Canada, but in each case arrangements have to be made with the government for permission to export. Under the general regulations of the war measures act, the export of vessels to non-British countries is prohibited, but the government has power to permit the exportation in all cases where conditions warrant.

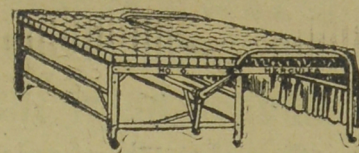
Soldier Handed Over.

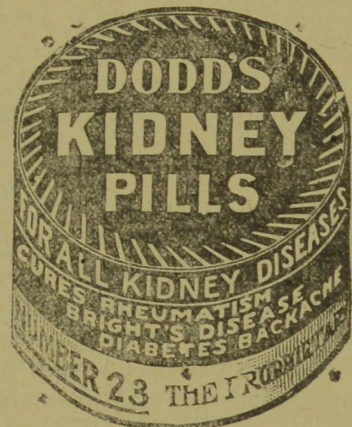
