## MR. LLOYD GEORGE HAS FORMED NEW MINISTRY

The Personnel Will Likely be Announced on Monday--Several Prominent Business Men Have Consented to Serve Under the New Premier--Labor Interests Will be Well Represented.

London, Dec. 7.—That David Lloyd George has now succeeded in forming a cabinet is indicated in the following announcement in the court circular tonight.

"The Right Hon. David Lloyd George had an audience with the King this evening and accepted His Majesty's offer of the post of Prime Minister and First Lord of the Treasury, and kissed His Majesty's hands upon his appointment."

## Business Men Going In.

The Daily Mail, which for obvious reasons may be supposed to have inside information, says Lloyd George has nearly completed his government, which will contain some eminent business men who are not politicians, notably Sir Albert Henry Stanley, managing director of the Metropolitan District, Central London and other street railways, who, the Mail asserts, will almost certainly be made President of the Board of Trade.

Andrew Bonar Law, according to the Daily Mail, is expected to be the Chancellor of the Exchequer, and the Earl of Derby War Minister. It adds that a Ministry of Labor is to be established, and that one of the Labor representatives will be Minister of Labor. Arthur Henderson and the Right Hon. George Nicol Barnes, or John Hodge, are expected to be among the Labor

members of the government.

Dr. Christopher Addison, under-secretary of munitions, the Daily Mail asserts, is likely to be appointed Minister of Munitions, and S. H. Lever, an accountant who reduced the cost of shells, will have a post in the ministry.

The Daily Mail denies that Lord Robert Cecil and Austin Chamberlain are antagonistic to Mr. Lloyd George. The newspaper says both of them visited Mr. Lloyd George this afternoon, as also did Lord Curzon of Kedleston. It has nothing to say regarding the portfolio of foreign minister.

"The fears that have been expressed that Colonel Winston Spencer Churchill will be a member of the new administration are unfounded," is a noteworthy statement in the Daily Mail. "He will not be included in it," the newspaper adds.

The Evening News, organ of Lloyd George, says that no names of new cabinet ministers are likely to be published until tomorrow, but that the new Premier already has sufficient offers to make up an extremely powerful government, which will include several business men of great and tried ability, irrespective of party values or ties.

Mr. Lloyd George's efforts, it is added, have been facilitated by a refusal of help from many of his former colleagues, because it was thus needless to consider their claims.

### INFORMATION WITHDRAWN IN LOCAL C. T. A. CASE

Will be Relaid--Information Laid In Three New Cases.

Activity in Canada Temperance Act matters continues in this city. Information in three new cases has been laid. Papers will be served shortly.

In the police court this morning information in a case against a hotel proprietor was withdrawn. Mr. R. B. Hanson, counsel for the prosecution, at first applied to the court for the arrest of the accused, but afterward he moved to withdraw the case, saying that information would be relaid.

A third offence case against another hotel man was adjourned this morning until Tuesday next.

### THE MARINA WAS NOT A TRANSPORT

Washington, Dec. 8.—Official information to the State Department establishes that the British ship *Marne*, sunk by a German submarine with the loss of six Americans, was in no sense a transport and was entitled to immunities of a peaceful merchantman.

Germany has announced her willingness to offer amends for the destruction in such a case.

## THE WHEAT MARKET.

Chicago, Dec. 8.—Weakness which resulted from the prospect of differences between the United States and Germany and from a stoppage of export buying, continued today in the wheat market here.

Opening prices, which ranged from 3/4 cents to 2 cents lower, with May at 176 1/4 to 177 1/4 and July at 146 1/4 to 147 1/4, was followed by rallies which, however, reached yesterday's closing figures.

### THE S. S. CALEDONIA HAS BEEN SUNK

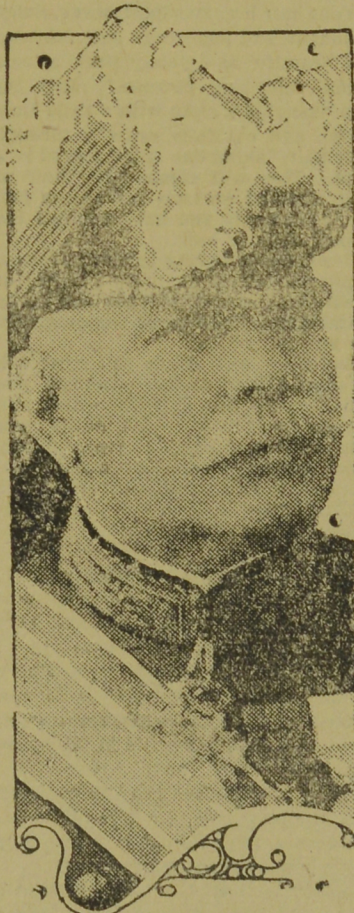
London, Dec. 8.—The Anchor Line steamship *Caledonia*, 9223 tons gross, is believed to have been sunk, says an announcement from Lloyds.

### ITALIAN SEAPLANES RAIDED TRIESTE

Rome, via Paris, Dec. 8.—Two Italian seaplanes raided Trieste on Thursday, according to an official statement issued by the Admiralty.

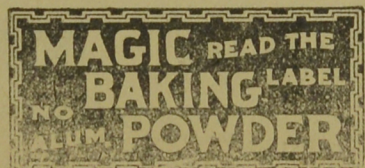
The statement says that the raiders dropped five bombs on naval sheds and returned unharmed, although subjected to a heavy fire from the Austrian anti-aircraft guns.

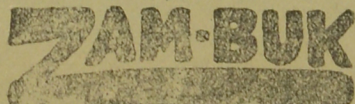
