SPECIAL INSTRUCTIONS.

According to special instructions issued to the recruiting officer, recruits are now wanted for the 115th, 125th, 140th and 145th Battalions. Recruits may enlist or be transferred to the 105th Battalion. The recruits for these battalions may be enlisted as stretcher-bearers as well as privates. The Divisional Signalling Company wants specialists and the Royal Garrison Artillery also wants men. Italians not liable to military service in their own country may enlist in the Canadian forces. A change in the regulations governing separation allowance make it applicable in cases where the father of the soldier is disabled and the soldier is the sole support of both parents.

JOINS 140th BATTALION.

Acting Battalion Sergt. Major H. Pearson of the 104th Battalion, has reverted to the rank of Company Sergt. Major with C Company, 140th Battalion, commanded by Major F. A. Good. This company will be stationed in Fredericton. It has a present strength of 123 which will be increased on the arrival of 124 men from Sussex or St. John.

depths by this outrage, calls upon the government henceforth to wage relentless war upon the army, navy and people capable of demonic crimes, such as this. 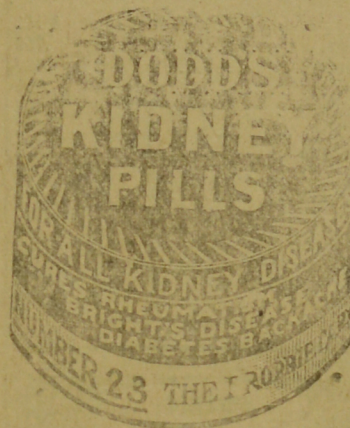
Messrs. J. A. Reynolds and George McDonald, also of the 104th, spent Sunday at their homes here.

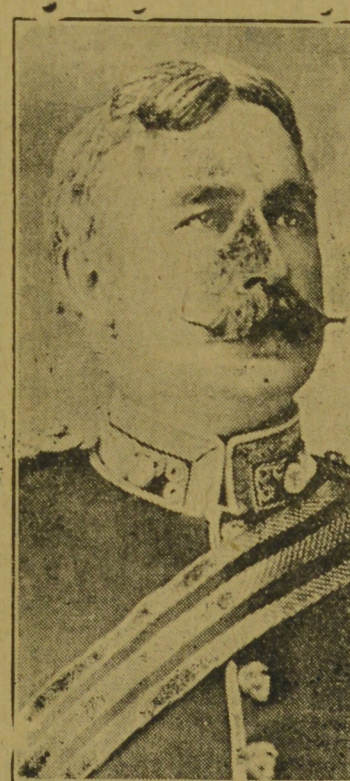
