





Washington, Oct. 12 .- The United States consul at St. Thomas reported today taht the hurricane which swept the Danish West Indies on Monday and Tuesday caused damage estimated at \$2,000,000 and left two-thirds of the native islanders in dire need of food and clothing and shelter. His despatch said

"Disaster general. Estimated loss \$25,000,000. Two-thirds of the population need food and clothing, one-third shelter. -Relief required, \$50,000, in cluding building material, food, clothing and money.
