

WONDERFUL RESULTS FROM PROHIBITION

Toronto, Oct. 4.—Results are wonderful, is the verdict of Superintendent J. Rogers, of the provincial police, who has just returned from a trip through the unorganized districts of Northern Ontario, to investigate for the department the working of the Ontario Temperance Act.

Superintendent Rogers was through the Porcupine, Schumacher and Timmins districts.

"A drunk," said he, "is really a relic in the north now. Much progress has been made by the authorities prior to the enactment of the prohibitory legislation, but the result of the working of the new act is everywhere regarded as phenomenal.
