## WOMAN'S COLUMN

### Unfermented Juice.

Wash the fruit, crush it slightly, put in a porcelain preserving kettle and simmer half an hour. Crush again and strain through a jelly bag. Measure the juice, and allow one-half cup sugar to each pint of juice. Bring the juice to the boiling point and skim well, add the sugar and boil six minutes. Fill the heated bottles and seal.

### PEAR PUDDING.

Chop fine one quart of mellow pears and place in alternate layers with buttered slices of stale bread in a pudding dish, adding sugar to sweeten, and grating of nutmeg. Pour over them one-half cup of water and bake in a slow oven for one hour or more. Serve hot with

cream, or cherry syrup from preserved cherries.

### CORN BREAD.

A cupful of milk, 1 cupful of flour, 1 1-2 cupful of yellow meal, 1/4 of a cupful of sugar, 1 1-2 teaspoonful of baking powder, 1 egg, 1 heaping tablespoonful of butter [melt the same] a pinch of salt.

### THINGS TO REMEMBER.

To make the best grape juice, only sound, ripe grapes which have been gathered in a cleanly manner should be used.

If the pulp is not well broken the yield of juice will be low.

For the best results, the press-

ing should be slow and gradual.

The clear juice should be separated from the sediment as soon as possible.

To pasteurize grape juice, heat it to 140 degrees for several hours, or to 160 degrees for a shorter time.

Grape juice is often defective in flavor and appearance from over-heating, or over-exposure to the air.

Unripe grapes do not make fine grape juice but grapes of fine acidity should be used when possible.

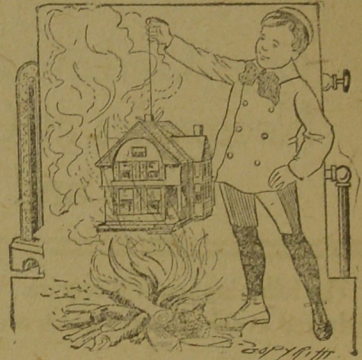

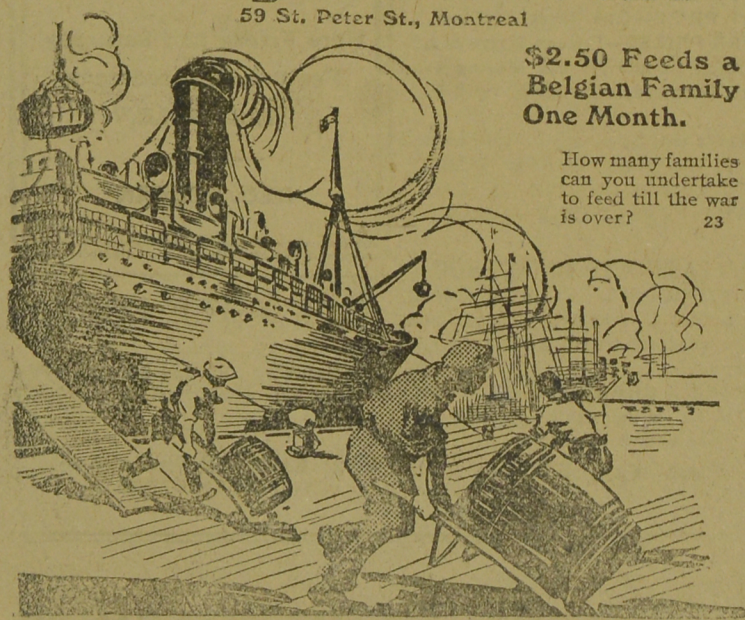
