

## DARES DEATH TO SAVE WOUNDED SOLDIERS

Takes Poison to Test New Serum,  
But Katherine Davies Survives  
Ordeal.

London, England, Dec. 2.—Katherine Mary Davies is heralded throughout England today as the greatest heroine in the European war!

France is proud of Emeline Moreau, Belgium of Edith Cavell, Austria-Hungary of "Sister Stephanie," Russia of Zoya Smirnov, women who, they say, distinguished themselves more than any man in the interest of their country.

But the heroine whose name will go down in European history as the name of Molly Pitcher is recorded in American history, is Mary Davies, who risked her life not on the battlefield, but in the little Ris-Orangeis hospital, in France.

Miss Davies has won her place in history by saving life, not destroying it. Two acts stand out in her life.

She perfected a system of sterilizing the dirt-stained germ-filled soldiers' uniforms to prevent the infection of wounds.

This has saved many thousands of

lives.

Then she risked her life to test a newly invented antidote for gangrene poisoning that resulted from German gas bombs.

Edith Cavell was martyred, shot by the Germans on a charge of being a spy.

Emeline Moreau, 17-year-old "heroine of Loos," killed five Germans single-handed.

Zoya Smirnov of Russia served in the trenches.

"Sister Stephanie," Countess Stephanie Lonyay, spent a fortune for war widows and orphans.

And Molly Pitcher of American revolution fame, manned a gun at which her husband had been shot, to keep off the British.

But no heroine until Miss Davies came along, did anything directly to save the lives of the soldiers at the front.

Sterilizing uniforms was big enough, but now comes what is called the biggest thing a woman has ever done in the war.

Dr. Taylor, of the American hospital in France, had been working on an antidote for the deadly gangrene poisoning that entered the bodies of soldiers exposed to the fire of German gas bombs.

He had tested it on rats and other small animals, but he had to have a human volunteer to be sure of the antidote's effect on a person.

Miss Davies heard of Dr. Taylor's want. Silently, without telling anyone about her plans, she inoculated herself with the deadly poison and called for Dr. Taylor.

She was his first human subject and she voluntarily staked her life on an experiment.

Dr. Taylor injected his antidote, a solution of hydrochloride of quinine.

Twenty-four hours later, Miss Davies arose from a stupor, positive evidence that Dr. Taylor's antidote will save thousands of soldiers who will be sent in the future to inhale the deadly gangrene gas of the Germans.

## WHAT ABOUT THE INHABITANTS OF MARS?

A Hope Expressed That They are Decidedly Above the Superficial People of the Earth.

It would be grossly unfair to Prof. Percival Lowell to assume from the latest reports of his discoveries and deductions that he has abandoned any part of his admirable theory relating to the hand-made canals of Mars. He has always contended that the lines he fancies he can see on the surface of that planet are zones of vegetation watered by canals, or channels, laboriously dug by the inhabitants.

Those zones are wide, and within their limits exists all the vegetation on Mars. What we object to is the assumption credited, fairly or unfairly, to Professor Lowell, that the creatures who, by the construction of these gigantic works, have defied nature and preserved life on their planet, are necessarily human beings.

If we must grant that the human being is the highest living type that we know anything of, it requires no great stretch of imagination, surely, to conceive of the existence of creatures of a higher type.

Humanity has not, thus far, made such a shining success of its birthright that we need assume that no more rational and purposeful living beings exist than men.

To be sure, all the gods of mythology are but supernatural men, but they are only the symbols of man's egotism.

Prof. Lowell has got as far away from the earth as Mars; he has made splendid discoveries about its seasons and its climate and the engineering genius of its inhabitants. He would not be going much further if he would admit the possibility of quite superior beings on this inhabited planet—and all the others in our little solar system and throughout the universe.

Man has his good traits, as the poets have noted; he is capable of making a great deal better world of this planet than he has yet tried to make; but we feel that it would be, on the whole, rather gratifying to be permitted to believe that the wonderfully gifted inhabitants of Prof. Lowell's Mars are beings of a better sort than highly developed men. There is no limit to the productiveness of nature. Why should there be to the imagination of Professor Lowell?

## ALIEN ENEMIES GETTING LAZY.

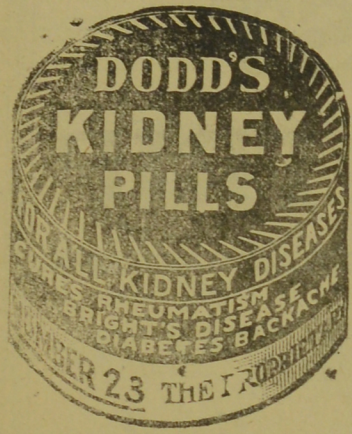
Interned Germans and Austrians Refused to Cut Their Firewood.

## No. 46

### A BY-LAW TO AMEND No. 16. A BY-LAW RELATING TO DOGS AND TO IMPOSE A TAX UPON THE OWNERS THEREOF.

City of Fredericton BE IT ENACTED by the City Council of the City of Fredericton, as follows:

(Sgd.) Moses Mitchell Mayor. 1. Sections one, two, three, four and twenty, entitled "No. 16. A By-Law relating to Dogs and to impose a Tax upon the Owners thereof," are hereby repealed and substituted in lieu thereof the sections of this by-law, as follows:

2. In this By-law, the expression "Dog" except where otherwise expressed, includes bitch.

3. In this By-law the expression "Owners" shall mean any person in possession of, or who shall harbor or suffer any dog to remain about his house or premises.

4. Every owner of a dog shall register such dog at the office of the City Treasurer on or before the first day of June in each and every year, the tax or fee for such registration shall be one dollar for the male dog and two dollars for a bitch, which must be paid to the City Treasurer before registration.

5. The owner of any dog who has not registered the same on or before the first day of June, as aforesaid, may register such dog at any time up to the first day of August next succeeding, for the sum of two dollars for the male dog and four dollars for the bitch.

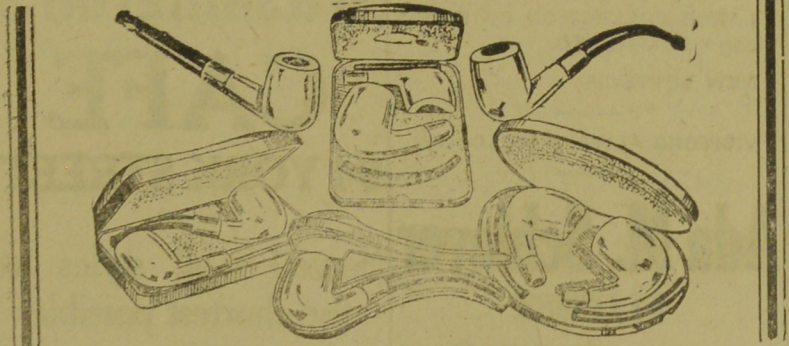
6. No owner of any bitch shall suffer or permit the same to be upon any street while in heat.

7. Any person convicted of a breach of any of the provisions of this By-law, shall be liable to a penalty of not exceeding fifty dollars.

Passed and enacted this fifth day of October, A. D. 1916.
