## GUNNER McADAM'S DEATH IS DEEPLY DEPILORED

Members of the Family Are in Receipt Of Many Messages of Sympathy.

Mr. and Mrs. James McAdam are receiving many expressions of sympathy over the death of their gallant son, Gunner Murray McAdam, who made the supreme sacrifice while fighting for the empire in France with an artillery unit. Gunner McAdam was one of the finest of many fine young men belonging to this city and vicinity who have laid down their lives on the battlefields of France. He was wounded in action some time ago and sent to England for treatment. He was offered a position there and could have secured his discharge from the military, but feeling that his duty was at the front, he returned and met his death.

When a boy five years old, Gunner McAdam, while playing on the street near his home, was run over by a heavy team and seriously injured. For days his life was despaired of, but he was made of good stuff and completely recovered from the effects of the accident. He lived to die a hero's death. At the service in St. Paul's Church last evening, Rev. J. S. Sutherland made a feeling reference to Gunner McAdam's death, and expressed the sympathy of the congregation with the parents and relatives of the deceased soldier.

### Case Again Adjourned.

Pioneer Sergt. Geo. Foss, of 236th Battalion, appeared in the police court this morning on the charges of interfering with the police and of refusing to assist the police in making an arrest. At the request of Lieut. Colonel Guthrie, the case was adjourned until Friday next, and bail was extended. A large number of witnesses for the defence were in court this morning.

Mrs. Martha Anderson, widow of the late George Anderson, of Kingsley, died this morning, aged 83 years, after an illness with pneumonia. Three sons and two daughters survive. The sons are Charles and George, of Kingsley, and Fred, of Fredericton. The daughters are Mrs. Fred Delong, of Kingsley and Mrs. Hedry Delong of Royal Road. Rev. H. H. Ferguson will conduct the service at 2 p. m. Tuesday. Interment will be made at Kingsley.

### York County Court.

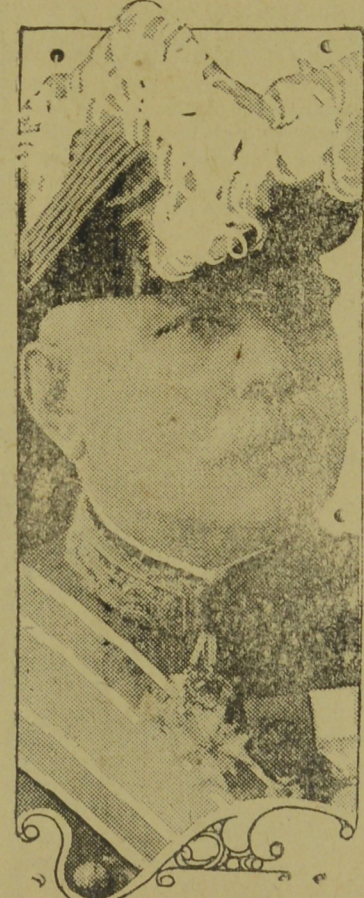
The York County Court met this afternoon and adjourned sine die. The Peck case has been settled. Another case on the docket goes over until next term.

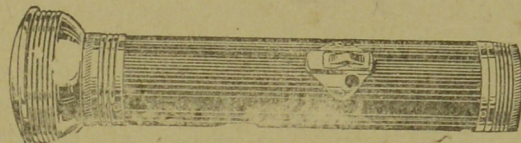
