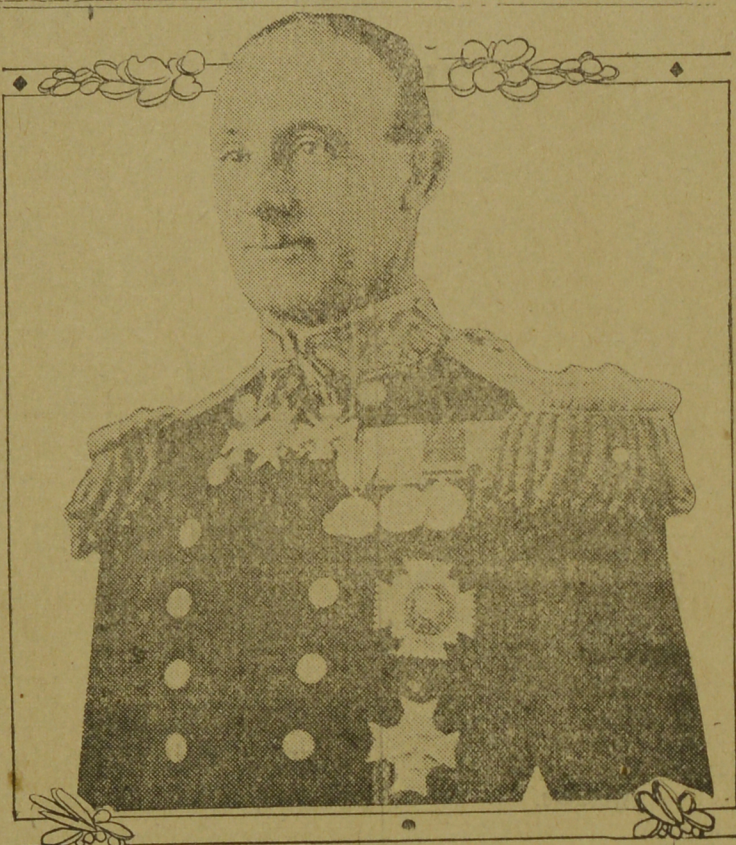
H. M. S. Iron Duke.

Dear Captain Guinness:
I wish you all success in your mission to Canada, and feel sure the response of the Dominion to the call of the Imperial Navy will equal in proportion that grand response given by Can-

Three Rivers, Que., Oct. 10.—A formation of an Inter-Provincial Betterment Commission was proposed to the Ontario business men now on "an entente cordial" tour through Canada, in an address of welcome presented to the visitors by the citizens of Three Rivers, the second oldest city in the Dominion, but a most prosperous manufacturing community, upon their arrival here today.

The address, which was printed and bound in a cover showing the Union Jack and the Tri-Color, with the legend "United we stand, divided we fall," was presented to each of the visitors.

The Need of Seamen.

As a direct result of new activity, on the part of the British Admiralty, Capt. Guinness is just starting on a recruiting tour of the west, and offices are being opened in all the principal cities and towns to enroll men.

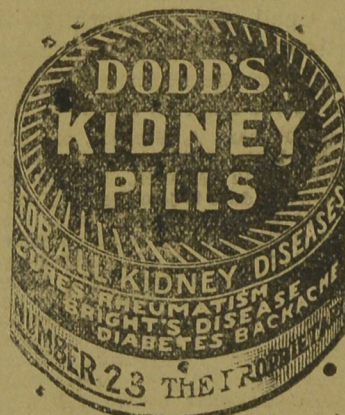
Captain Guinness says: "When Admiral Jellicoe writes from the Grand Fleet (somewhere in the North Sea) in this vein, we can visualize the need for more men very easily, and men are needed quickly. New fleets are putting to sea—battleships, cruisers, destroyers, submarines—and they must be manned."

"Untrained men, men who have never seen the sea, but who have a desire to serve and have a good physique, will see service almost at once in the navy."

"With 900 to 1,000 men in some ships, the recruit can be used in many ways and his chief value at the moment lies in being able to release trained sailors for special duty or, in the technical term, 'dilute the strength.'"

"Recruits for the navy will not be held in Canada, but shipped in detachments to training depots at various points in England almost immediately after enlistment."

"Thousand men are needed by Christmas, and as many more as possible."
