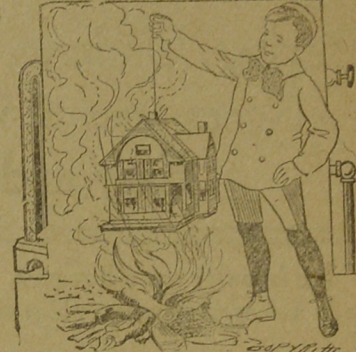

Conditions of Agreement with Neutral Relief Commission respected by Germany
