RECIPES WORTH TRYING.

Marlboro Pie.

Peel and slice 6 good sized apples and cook in very little water until tender; 2 tablespoons of melted butter, yolks of 4 eggs, juice and grated rind of 1 large lemon: mix altogether and bake in an under crust.

Beat the whites of eggs stiff y, a tablespoon of sugar to each egg, spread on top the pie when nearly done and return to oven to brown.

Clam Frappe.

Two quarts clams in their shells; wash and scrub the shells and rinse thoroughly. Put half a cup of water in a kettle, add clams, cover tightly and cook until the shells open. Skim out all the clams, pour off the water, remove shells and tough membrane. Put clams into the water, let them stand 10 minutes: then skim them out, let

the water settle; strain through cheesecloth: freeze as a sort of frozen mush. Serve in glass with chilled, salted, whipped cream on top of each serving.

BUTTONS MUCH USED.

GUESSING IT OUT ON A GAME OF CHANCE

When W. Bert Lint's good horse, A Game of Chance, was sent against the track record in the closing heat of the free-for-all at the St. Stephen track on Sept. 15th, the gentlemen in the stand made an estimate of the time that the handsome stallion would make.

Dr. McCuaig, of McAdam, judge, wrote it as 2.12½, R. W. Whitlock, secretary, wrote 2.13½; F. L. Thompson, Woodstock, timer, 2.13½; W. H. Keyes, timer, 2.13½; D. L. McDonald, Eastport, judge, 2.14; F. M. Murchie, president, 2.14; R. M. Webber, timer, 2.14; F. D. J. Graham, starter, 2.14; C. W. Bell, of St. John, veteran driver of New Brunswick, 2.15.

The heat was trotted this way: Quarter in 33¾, half in 1.07, three-quarters in 1.40½, the mile in 2.13½. The watches of the three timers and the secretary all caught the heat at exactly the same time.

The track record had been held by Hugh Love's Lady Fondly at 2.14½ since 1914.

TO RE-ESTABLISH POPE'S POWER

German Catholic Newspapers Trying to Win Favor of Vatican.

London, Sept. 20.—A movement in favor of re-establishment of the temporal powers of the Pope is implied by the Amsterdam correspondent of the Exchange Telegraph Co. to have been inaugurated by Roman Catholic newspapers in Germany, with the idea of drawing the Vatican wholly away from Italian influence.

GERMAN POLITICAL MEETING.

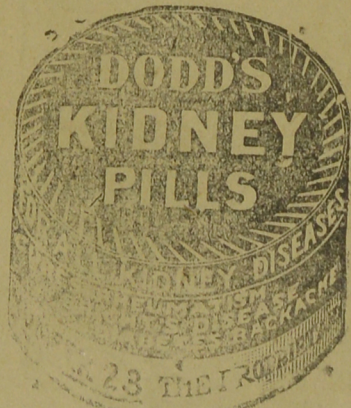

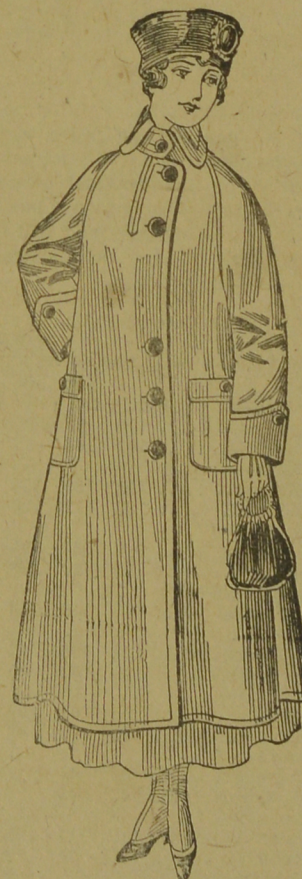
