Berlin, Feb. 18.—(By wireless to Sayville)—The Hungarian minister of finance has concluded arrangements with a group of German banks for a loan of 150,000,000 marks. The loan will be covered by three per cent. treasury bonds, redeemed in two and one-half years.

At the corner of Northumberland street the pair took to the sidewalk and did some damage to Libby Brothers' store. They were caught in Woodstock Road.

Bathurst Visited By Serious Fire

BATHURST, N. B., Feb. 18.—W. J. Kent & Company's General store here, covering two blocks frontage, was gutted by fire early today. The loss is estimated at between \$175,000 and \$200,000, with insurance of about \$90,000. An open window is taken to indicate either incendiary or fire accidentally caused by a burglar.

Supreme Court Delivers Judgments

COURT
Judgments were given in several cases by the Court of Appeal this morning. The judges sitting were Chief Justice McLeod, Judges White, Grimmer, Barry and Crockett.

In the case from Queensbury that achieved much local prominence, in which a conviction against Fred Elliott for creating a disturbance at an entertainment in aid of the Belgian Relief Fund, was quashed by Judge Wilson of the York County Court, judgment was given making rule absolute to quash the judge's order of June 1, 1915, in favor of defendant's counsel for \$432 of costs, including \$250 of counsel fees.

In this case the review had occupied eight days in the County Court. The appeal was before Judges White, Grimmer and Crockett. The effect of the decision handed down today in the Appeal Court is taken to mean the termination of any proceedings relative to costs.

In the case of The Dalhousie Lumber Company Limited, vs Walker, Judge Grimmer read judgment refusing the appeal, with costs.

In the case of Amherst Pianos Limited vs Adney, Judge Grimmer read judgment dismissing the appeal of the defendant, with costs. This case was noted on account of the defendant, Mrs. Tappan Adney of Woodstock, appearing before the court in person and arguing in support of her appeal.

In the case of Landry vs The Bathurst Lumber Company, Judge Grimmer read the judgment of the appeal before Chief Justice McLeod, Judge Barry and Judge Grimmer. Judge Barry read judgment dissenting. A new trial is refused, Judge Barry dissenting.

In the case of Duchette vs Likely, Chief Justice McLeod read judgment to set aside verdict and to enter verdict for the plaintiff, with costs. Judge Barry delivered a written judgment dissenting. The appeal was allowed and a verdict for the defendant was set aside and costs here and in the court below and verdict entered for plaintiff for \$1867.23.

In the case of Robertson vs Norton Judge White read judgment of the court. A new trial without costs is ordered.

This afternoon argument in the case of The King vs Dimock is ordered.

Reports Mutiny Of Indian Troops

Berlin, Feb. 18 (by wireless to Sayville).—A mutiny of Hindoo troops in Egypt is reported by the Cologne Volke Zeitung, as quoted by the Overseas News Agency. It is said an entire regiment mutinied, killing twelve officers, including the commanding officer, a major, and that other Hindoo troops went over to the mutineers.

After a battle of two hours, it is said the mutinous troops were routed.

More Money For Prussian Railway

Berlin, Feb. 18 (by wireless to Sayville).—An appropriation of 313,000,000 marks for the Prussian state railroads, is provided in a bill introduced in the Prussian Diet. The money is to be used for construction of new tracks and branch lines, completion of several lines and for new cars.

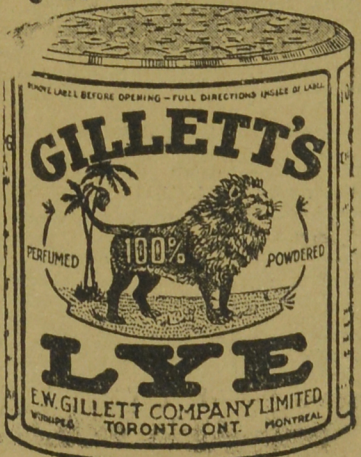
Cold Wave Is Due In Ontario

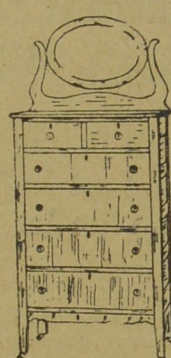
MONTREAL TO MAKE A LOAN OF TWO MILLIONS

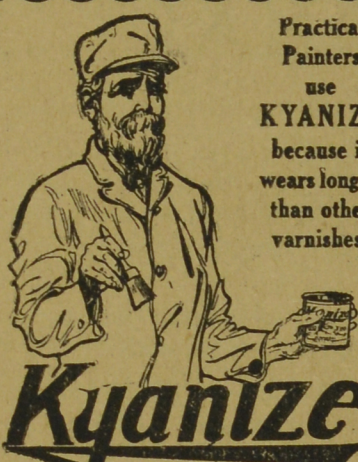

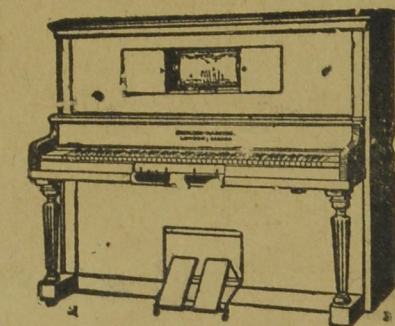
