CANADIAN TROOPS CONTINUE GOOD WORK

Ottawa, Sept. 16.—Canadian headquarters in France, via London, Sept. 15.—The ordinary activities of trench warfare, with which the Canadians are now so well acquainted, continued to occupy their attention during the past week. The steady training of specialists which has been proceeding for several months is bearing fruit.

Our snipers showed their skill and ingenuity and were able each day to claim a number of the enemy.

Sniper Dillon, of a Winnipeg battalion lay 25 yards in front of our own trenches the whole of one day and although the Germans made efforts to locate him, he was too well concealed.

The Fine Art of Sniping.

He secured three direct hits and pierced several loopholes. At one part of the line held by a Montreal battalion, the Germans began a bombardment with heavy trench mortars and threw about thirty bombs, some of which exploded in our trench.

In retaliation our mortar batteries replied with two hundred bombs of all sizes, and effectually silenced the enemy.

A large earthwork which the Germans had constructed after a labor of several weeks was completely demolished by the accurate shooting of one of our Canadian siege batteries under command of Major Cape. The Canadian field artillery were very active in dispersing working parties and in night shooting upon the enemy lines of communication.

In each battery one gun is set apart as a "sniper," which is ready to shoot at the slightest sign of movement in the enemy's lines. These "sniper guns" are a cause of great annoyance to the Germans. As usual, defensive patrols were constantly in front of our trenches at night. Two encounters with the enemy took place. In one case Lieut. Matthews, with three scouts from an Edmonton battalion, surprised a party of five Germans who were hiding in a large shell crater.

MONKEYS TO BE USED IN EXPERIMENTAL WORK

San Francisco, Cal., Sept. 16.—Fifty monkeys, the survivors of 100 brought here from the Orient, to be used in connection with infantile paralysis work, were on the way today to Rockefeller Institute in New York. Lung troubles killed fifty of them after their arrival here.

The monkeys are a ferocious lot, and Dr. H. H. Hicks, local head of the United States Bureau of Animal Industry, had much difficulty in keeping the larger ones from killing their smaller companions.

ZULUS DO AWAY WITH DEFORMED CHILDREN

Chicago, Sept. 16.—A club is the solution of the eugenic problem among the Zulus of Africa, said J. H. Balmer, for thirty-two years a resident of that country, before the International Lyceum convention here last night.

When a baby is born to Zulu parents and it appears to be below the Zulu standard, it is given a gentle wallop over the head, he explained. After that there is a funeral.

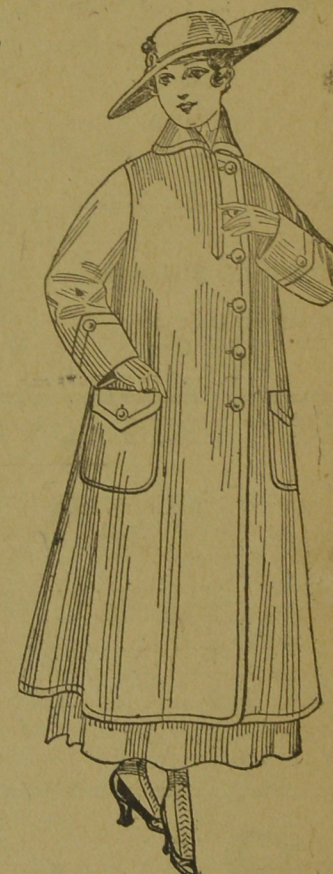
