THE OLD TURK PARTY BECOMING ACTIVE

London, Aug. 7.—The London Times Constantinople correspondent has telegraphed as follows under date of 3rd August:
"The movement in Constantinople against Enver Pasha and the committee of union and progress is rapidly gaining strength. The Old Turk party has been latterly reinforced by the clandestine addition of many important persons, who, while openly professing loyalty to the policy of the young Turks, secretly favor the cause of the Entente and steadily aim at the overthrow of Enver Pasha and his partisans.

Their resolve to put an end to the present regime has been quickened by the prospect of the approaching ruin of Turkey. Once their plan is accomplished, they would immediately ask for peace in the hope of obtaining comparatively favorable terms from the Entente powers.

IRISH WOMAN WITH SERBIAN ARMY

Paris, Aug. 7.—Miss Flora Sanders, an Irishwoman, who is a sergeant in the Serbian army, has arrived at Toulon on her way to rejoin her regiment after a holiday in Ireland, according to the Matin.

Miss Sanders was in Serbia when the war broke out and joined a hospital. Later on she enlisted as a regular soldier and went through the last campaign, taking part in the disastrous retreat to Durazzo.

ALBERTA MINERS MAKE COMPROMISE

Calgary, Alta., Aug. 7.—Coal operators and miners in conference have effected a compromise agreement for an average increase of approximately eight per cent. over present wages. A schedule will be submitted to a referendum of the miners.

ELECTRICAL STORM STRIKES QUEBEC The Hay Crop Seriously Damaged in Some Sections.

Quebec, Aug. 7.—A serious hail, rain and electric storm struck Quebec and district Saturday evening about six o'clock, and wrought heavy damage to grain crops and in some places where the hay was not yet baled this crop was also seriously hit.

A number of houses in the surrounding communities were either hit or unroofed by the gale that swept at a rate of 59 miles an hour.

At St. Austen, among other accidents, four children of the Joseph Cote family were struck and number by lightning while at prayer.

They later recovered, but all bear marks of the shock. No real estimate of the extent of damage as to property and crops can be yet established, as telephone connections are greatly interrupted.

CASE OF HEAT STROKE ON BRITISH STEAMER

London, Aug. 7.—The Peninsular & Oriental liner Dongola, has arrived at Bombay from Bastra, Asiatic Turkey, serving as a hospital ship, and reports 130 cases of heat stroke during the voyage. Of these seventeen were fatal and there were five other deaths, which probably were caused by the heat.

The voyage was made under trying circumstances, since it was necessary to turn the ship frequently as the wind shifted, for the purpose of ventilating the wards.

MUNITION WORKERS TO POSTPONE HOLIDAYS

London, Aug. 7.—The exception of a portion of coal miners of South Wales and the cotton brokers of Lancashire, the British working people today locally accepted the decision of the government that holidays should be postponed until the demand for munitions was not urgent.

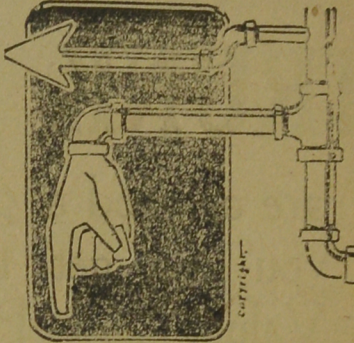
