The speech of Lieut. Col. Guthrie in the Legislature was certainly a party pelle. bombshell. Joshua Malakoff Chappell made a mistake when he tried to make Guthrie responsible for the pitiful graft amount of \$75. The eagerness, however, with which his assertion was welcomed by those troublesome party whips, Woods and Price, gives some idea of the desperateness of the Government situation.


