### TRAIN SERVICE FOR DOLLAR DAY

Arrangements have been made with the Fredericton and Grand Lake Coal & Railway Co. that they will issue one-fare tickets to parties attending Dollar Day; tickets to be issued on Tuesday, 15th, Wednesday, 16th, good to return on Thursday, 17th.

Arrangements have been made with the Canadian Pacific Railway Co. that parties ten or more from one point can have single fare for round trip, limit three days.

Special arrangements have been made with the Canadian Government Railways that a train will leave Marysville on Feb. 16th, at 7 p.m., and will return, leaving Fredericton at 10.30 p.m.

Return tickets will be sold to parties of ten or more for first class one-way fare, allowing three days' limit on all trains running into Fredericton; that is, including from Newcastle, Gagetown, Centreville and other points.
