CONFESSION WAS PROBABLY A TAKE

Albion, N. Y., Aug. 14.—The district attorney of Orleans county announced today that Erwin King had repudiated completely the confession he made at Little Valley, N. Y., on August 10, that he was guilty of the murder of Chas. Phelps and his housekeeper, Mary Wolcott at West Shelby (Albion) on March 21, 1915.

Charles Stielow is now in Sing Sing prison under sentence of death for these murders, but was relieved recently on the day set for his execution. Stielow's friends believed King's confession would save the life of the condemned man.

The district attorney said today that King late last night swore he had nothing to do with the West Shelby murders.

KAISER ON WESTERN FRONT.

Emperor William Gives Naval and Field Forces "the Once Over."

London, Aug. 14.—Emperor William on his return to the western front reviewed portions of the field army and the navy, in Flanders, says an official telegram received in Amsterdam from Berlin, and transmitted by Reuter's correspondent.

The Emperor then visited the Somme district, expressed to the men and leaders fighting there his grateful appreciation, and welcomed troops just returning from battle.

FRENCH HISTORIAN DEAD.

DOUBLE DROWNING AT SALMON RIVER

Two Men Lose Their Lives on Saturday Under Sad Circumstances.

(St. John Times.)

A double drowning accident occurred at Brown's Landing, Salmon River, on Saturday, when Charles Carroll, aged 22, of Scotchtown, and Moses R. Brown, of Coal Mines, aged 50, were drowned in the waters of Salmon River under very sad circumstances.

From what is known of the accident it seems that Carroll had boarded the steamer May Queen at Scotchtown and was on his way to visit the Brown home in Coal Mines. As the boat did not pull into the wharf at Brown's Landing, Mr. Brown came out in a small boat to take Carroll ashore.

One story is that Carroll, in stepping into the small boat from the steamer, stumbled and fell into the water. Mr. Brown made an attempt to save him and as he reached out his hand, upset the row boat he was occupying. Carroll came up only once and was not seen again. Mr. Brown being thrown into the water, and probably not able to swim also went down before help could reach him from the steamer or landing.

There also has arisen the matter of the starting signal on the steamer, with a report that the vessel hit the row boat. An inquest is being held.

It was understood that young Carroll was about to be married to one of Mr. Brown's daughters.

Mr. Brown leaves a wife and a large family. He was well known in the North End, where he did business with the merchants for years.

The May Queen is expected at Indian town this evening, and with her coming the full particulars of the occurrence will be available.

Immediately after the accident grappling began, but it was not until about 9 o'clock Saturday night that the two bodies were recovered. The sad tidings spread a gloom over the entire community about the Grand Lake. It is understood that Carroll has relatives in St. John.

The funeral of Mr. Brown took place this afternoon at 2:30 o'clock.

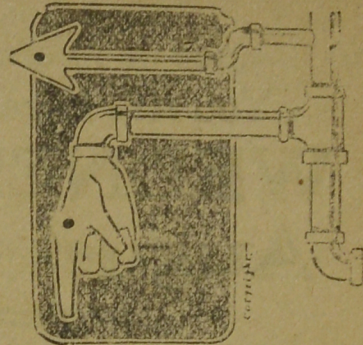
