Representatives of the Maritime
Electric Company and the City of
Fredericton will meet in the City Hall
on Thursday at 2.30 p.m. for the pur-
pose of trying to reach a satisfactory
solution to the rates question. This
conference is the result of the Daily
Mail's untiring efforts in promoting an
amicable settlement.

The conference will be attended by
the city of Fredericton Electric Light
Committee composed of Mayor W. G.
Clark, Alderman Hedley Forbes, chair-
man, Alderman C. L. Dougherty, and
Alderman Warren Maxwell.

In talking with the Daily Mail this
morning, V. A. Ainsworth stated that
the Maritime Electric Company would
be represented by himself, T. J. Cole-
man, Calais, and F. H. Golding, Cam-
bridge, Massachusetts. It is not known
at the present time whether the com-
pany will be represented by any
others or not, but it was intimated by
Mr. Ainsworth that there would prob-
ably be one or two more representa-
tives.

Mayor W. G. Clark stated this morn-
ing that he expects that the confer-
ence will be successful and was of the
opinion that an arrangement satisfac-
tory to both parties could be reached.

The conference will be strictly pri-
vate to the public and press.

BETTER BACON
AIM FEDERAL DEPT.
OF AGRICULTURE

Dominion Experimental
Station Here To Con-
duct Experiment

Important To Farmers

If Successful Will Be
Great Boom To N. B.
Bacon Producers

The Dominion Department of Agri-
culture is endeavoring to introduce to
the farmers of this country a breed of
swine that will yield a better quality
of bacon. If they are successful it
will mean the retaining of thousands
of dollars in Canada which is now go-
ing out of the country to purchase ba-
con.

C. F. Bailey, superintendent of the
Dominion Experimental Station here,
informed the Daily Mail this morning
that his station has just received a
white Yorkshire boar pig from the
Quarantine Station at Quebec City.
This particular boar is one of a large
importation purchased by the Domin-
ion Department of Agriculture in Eu-
rope. The boar was bred in Sweden,
and although Great Britain is the ori-
ginal breeding place of the Yorkshire,
it is reputed that Sweden has develop-
ed an even better breed.

As an experiment it is planned to
breed this boar with some of the best
breed sows in this country, and put
the young pigs on a feeding test next
summer. If the experiment is as suc-
cessful as is hoped for, it will mean
that the farmers of this province and
the rest of the Dominion will benefit
greatly.

Mr. Bailey stated that they hope to
produce a very fine breed of pig that
will in time greatly increase the qual-
ity and supply of bacon in New Brun-
swick and other provinces.

If the experiment is successful the
Dominion will continue to import the
Yorkshires from Sweden for breeding
purposes.

IN DORCHESTER
PENITENTIARY

Man Who Gave Name of
Daniel McCormick Has
Many Aliases

Police Record

Fingerprints Nemesis of
Man of Many Names
Arrested Here

The far-reaching arm of the law by
means of the science of fingerprinting
uncovered a police record in the city
police court this morning that was
hitherto unexpected in the case of a
man who gave his name and address
as Daniel McCormick, of Sydney, and
who was found guilty last week of
stealing a suit of clothes from the
York Hotel.

McCormick, who, according to po-
lice report, has more names and aliases
than anyone whom the local police
have ever accosted, was sentenced
this morning by Magistrate Limerick
in the city police court to two years
in Dorchester Penitentiary for his
most recent crime. This sentence was
prompted by the uncovering by local
police of a criminal record that would
shock the most diabolic law-breaker.

Fingerprints, taken of the prisoner
after his recent arrest, were sent to
Ottawa and the Department of Justice
in the federal capital returned a
lengthy report of the prisoner. Ot-
