#### CABINET COUNCILS

How British Affairs of State Are Strictly Guarded

In England Cabinet Councils are conducted in the strict privacy, al-though very occasionally important officials and other outsiders have at ometals and other outsiders have attended a meeting for the purpose of giving information or advice on specific matters; while the remarkable step was taken of inviting Sir Robert Borden, as Prime Minister of Canada, to attend one of the meetings Canada, to attend one of the meetings while he was in England. Otherwise the most stringent measures are adopted to secure the inviolability of Cabinet proceedings. Trusted janitors keep watch outside to guard against the possibility of eavesdropping, while the very blotting pads are destroyed after each meeting lest they should betray anything that has taken should betray anything that has taken

Touching this matter of Cabinet remarked in a public speech that she, at least, could not disclose any, since her husband never told them to her, but it is well known that other Cabinet but it is well known that other Cabinet Ministers have not always been equally discreet. In this connection it may be recalled that the famous Lady Holland once asked, at one of the Whig consultations at Holland House, why her husband should not be Foreign Secretary. "Why, ma'am," said Lord John Russell, bluntly, "they say you open all Holland's letters." Mr. Gladstone, on the other hand, was of opinion that a Minister need have no secrets from his wife, and how no secrets from his wife, and how nobly Mrs. Gladstone justified his con-

fidence is well known.

Another aid to the preservation of Another aid to the preservation of Cabinet secrets is the system of communication between the members which is adopted. This is effected by the circulation of special despatch boxes, and one of the most important possessions of each Minister is the "key" which unlocks all these boxes. In all memoirs of Ministers will be found constant reference to "sending round a box," groans at the arrival of "piles of boxes." from other departments and so on. When a Minister. partments, and so on. When a Minis ter wishes to circulate some memoran dum among his colleagues for informa tion or comment he does it in this way gether the Cabinet is a very won derful institution.

### **RECORD RAILWAYS**

Russia has beaten all records in railway construction. She built a great double-track, broad-guage line from Alexandrovsk, an ice-free port on her north coast, down to Petrograd, and completed it within six months. It is 1,220 miles long, and 10,000 men, mostly prisoners, were employed upon it. Then look at the Great Siberian railway! Five thousand five hundred and twenty-seven miles of line, most of it across wild plain and forest and over great mountain ranges, in a climate where for five months of the year the soil is frozen to the consistency of granite, and all this in eight summers! It is a record which, even in North America, has never been equalled. It cost one hundred and forty millions,

America, has never been equalled. It cost one hundred and forty millions, and since its completion another twenty-two millions have been spent in improving the line.

The best work done in America under similar, but even worse conditions, was the construction of the White Pass and Yukon Railway, which opened up the route from the coast to Skagway to the gold region of Klondike. Within twenty miles from its starting point this line has to climb the White Pass, a height of just off three thousand feet. When the station at the summit was opened seven feet of snow surrounded it, and the thermometer registered 57 degrees below zero—that is, 89 degrees of frost!
