COCOA FROM GREAT BRITAIN IS REACHING THE GERMANS

Lord Lansdowne Admits in the House of Lords That There is Some Truth in London Daily Mail's Charge--Foreign Office Comes in For Criticism.

LONDON, Jan. 14.—The Daily Mail, in view of its campaign against the government on the ground that the government is allowing food to go to the enemy and products to leave that country, is triumphant over Lord Lansdowne's admission in the House of Lords that quantities of cocoa from Great Britain probably are reaching her enemies, and the statement that the government regards the situation as serious and contemplate taking measures to remedy it.

Basil Clarke, who went to Copenhagen for the Daily Mail, and there gathered material for the campaign, has another article in this morning's issue alleging that the importation of British tires into Copenhagen is enabling the Germans to export numbers of cheap automobiles without tires to Denmark. There they are filled with British tires and the Germans are thus able to pay for the goods which they are receiving from Denmark, lessening the slump in German exchange rates.

The Morning Post editorially draws attention to the blockade question, saying: "There are at last hopeful signs that parliament is recovering from the mental catalepsy which was one result of the formation of the coalition ministry." It condemns the Foreign Office for making useless agreements with neutral traders and adds: "We can only repeat that so long as the Foreign Office usurps the proper business of the Admiralty so long will the war continue."

FRENCH OFFICIAL REPORT.

PARIS, via London, Jan. 14.—The French official statement issued this afternoon follows:

"There was slight activity or artillery during the night to the south of the Somme river, in the Lihons sector. One of our patrols attacked an enemy patrolling party, which fled, leaving two dead and one wounded behind. In Champagne our fire reached and dispersed German troops who were in movement in sections of trenches at Butte du Mesnil."

KAISER SENDS SWORD TO SULTAN.

LONDON, Jan. 14.—The German Emperor, according to a Constantinople despatch by Reuter's Amsterdam correspondent, has sent a sword to the Sultan of Turkey, together with a congratulatory message in recognition of the success of the Turkish campaign on the Gallipoli peninsula.

In his telegram Emperor William send he had learned with great satisfaction that the enemy army had been forced completely to evacuate Gallipoli.

THE POPE AND THE WAR.


ROME, Jan. 14.—There is a general belief in Vatican circles that the Pope will deliver another important allocution about the war in the consistory at the end of February. It is considered certain that the Pontiff will call the consistory for either the end of February or shortly afterwards, to impose red hats upon the newly created Cardinals, Scapinelli and Fruhwirth, nuncios at Vienna and Munich respectively, who would thus leave their posts, being replaced according to present reports, at Vienna by Monsignor Locatelli, now internuncio at Buenos Aires and at Munich for Brazil.

REITERATES ARMISTICE REPORT.

LONDON, Jan. 14.—A wireless despatch from Rome reiterating the report of an armistice between Austria and Montenegro, states that it was Austria which proposed cessation of hostilities, with the purpose of negotiating a separate peace.

REPRISAL AGAINST TURKS.

PARIS, Jan. 13.—As reprisal for the internment of French subjects in Turkey, the French authorities today arrested Salit Bey, archivist of the Turkish Embassy, his wife and daughter.
