### SUNFLOWERS PAYING GROP

(Kanses City, Mo., Correspondence.) In Southeast Missouri farmers raise sunflowers to feed chickens. Many farmers in New Madrid county Missouri, are growing sunflowers for seed on as large a scale as thry grow

The seeds are high in oil and pro tein and make an excellent feed They are used chiefly as a feed for parrots and as a part of the com-mercial poultry feeds. The seeds are purchased each fall by general seed buyers from St. Louis.
