Hamilton, Ont. Leader and Dist. Gov. Rod McDonald Speak.

Norman W. Helwig, of Hamilton, Ontario, president of Gyro International is a visitor to Fredericton today and this evening at Loyalist building, he will be feted by the local Gyros at a specially prepared entertainment. Mr. Helwig is accompanied by Mrs. Helwig on a tour of the Maritime provinces.

The Gyro leader and his wife arrived here today at noon and were accompanied by District Governor Rod McDonald, of Moncton, who is expected to speak this evening along with Mr. Helwig.

The entertainment tonight will be in the character of a dance and dinner and the program will include also a solo by Charles Johnston, and a reading by Mrs. R. H. Wright. Besides Mr. Helwig and Mr. McDonald, the president of the local Gyros, Donald Smith, will speak.

It is the first official visit of the Gyro head to this province since his election to office. Last evening at Saint John where he was entertained by the Gyros there, he spoke in glowing terms of the hospitality shown him and his wife, of the scenery and grandeur of Maritime province landscape and stated that he intended to be back in 1936 at the International convention and will remain for hunting and fishing.

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DEBATERS OF U. N. B. PICKED LAST EVENING

William B. Morrissey of Newcastle and N. M. MacLeod, City.

MEET OXFORD

Topic of Practice Debate Last Night Interesting One.

William B. Morrissey, of Newcastle, and Norman M. MacLeod, of Fredericton, were selected last night to represent U. N. B. in debate against an Oxford-Cambridge team which will debate here on October 31st. Morrissey and MacLeod were selected from fourteen debaters who spoke in trial. The subject of the trial debate was "Resolved that this house would rather have written "Gray's "Elegy" than have taken Quebec". This is also the subject which the University of New Brunswick team will debate against Oxford-Cambridge.

The speeches made last night by the fourteen debaters competing for places on the team were mostly of a high standard. The judges, Dr. C. C. Jones, Professor Malcolm MacPherson and Professor B. S. Kierstead announced that the selection of Morrissey and MacLeod had been made with considerable difficulty and that they had found the standard of speaking above that of other years.

In the trial Morrissey presented an argument for the negative. He said that there was a "poetry of words", and also a "poetry of life". In taking Quebec Wolfe had written a chapter in the "poetry of life", and had left behind him an inextinguishable monument in a whole continent of similar people with the same speech and ideals—a whole continent without frontiers and fortifications, a continent of peace. Democracy and good government had grown out of the British possession of Canada. The poetry of life was written in the lives of the people.

MacLeod supported the affirmative. "To take Quebec" is interpreted as war and the misery, chaos, unhappiness and bloodshed that it brings. "To write those lines" is peace and literature serenity and art. It is the sword or the pen. Canadians, being a sane people standing aloof from national hatred and jealousy, would choose the pen.

Two young men, Maurice Derry and Percy Tracey appeared before Magistrate Limerick in the police court yesterday afternoon, charged with the theft of clothing from the Sunbury county range. Three witnesses were heard for the prosecution and Derry took the stand in his own defense before the case was set over for Wednesday afternoon at 2:30 for judgment.

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COMPILATION OF DOMINION VOTERS' LIST

Major J. S. Scott Confering with Enumerators in This Constituency

NEW VOTERS' LIST

Organization Work is Well Underway: Registrar at No. Lake

Major John S. Scott, secretary-treasurer of York county and Registrar of York-Sunbury returned today from North Lake where he has been conferring with enumerators in that locality respecting the compilation of the revised Dominion of Canada voters' list.

Major Scott reports that the work is now well underway with the various localities organized and proceeding rapidly with the work of revising the lists. The final dates for revision are November 13, 14 and 15.

The work is expected to be completed by October 23 and civic and parish officials have been named by Major Scott for duty as enumerators. A total of 61 have been appointed for duty as enumerators.

SPENT COMFORTABLE NIGHT

Harry Mogard, 50-year-old Swedish quarry foreman, who received a compound fracture of the nose and several broken ribs in an accident at Cherrybank on Saturday evening, spent a comfortable night at the hospital. Mogard was in charge of the contractor's trap rock quarrying operations in the quarry at Springhill creek or Cherrybank. The accident occurred when he was carried off a ledge on the face of the quarry when a slide occurred. Mogard was swept into the bucket of the steam shovel and this probably saved his life, since it interrupted his fall.

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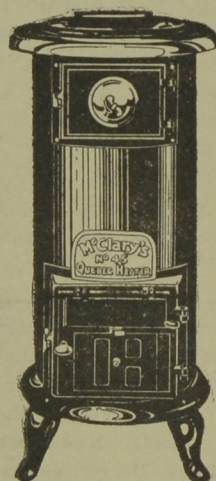
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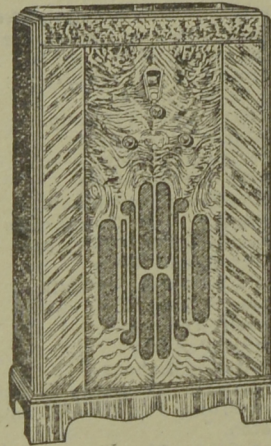
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
