FINAL STANDING IN NOVA SCOTIA ELECTIONS 32 LIBS., 11 CONS.

Halifax, June 21.—Latest returns show that the Liberal victory in the Nova Scotia provincial elections held on Tuesday was even greater than was at first reported. Instead of thirty-one Liberals and twelve Conservatives elected, the count now shows thirty-two Liberals and eleven Conservatives, a majority of twenty-one for the Liberal government.

The additional seat for the government was obtained in Inverness county, where two Liberals were elected instead of one Liberal and one Conservative, as was at first reported. Donald MacLeilan, M. P. P., and John C. Bourinot were elected with majorities of 155 and 71 respectively.

The funeral took place in Campbell Settlement, his former home.

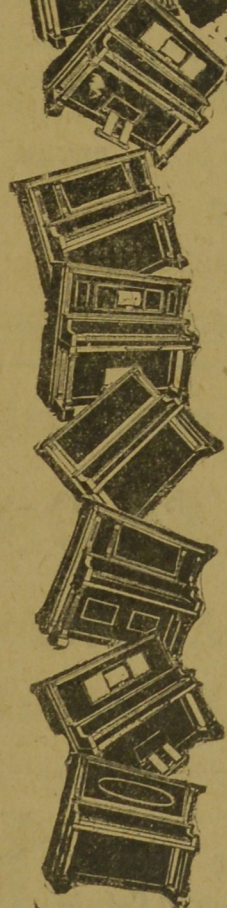
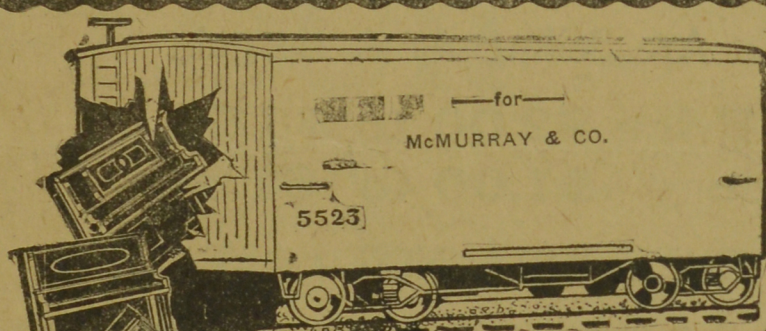

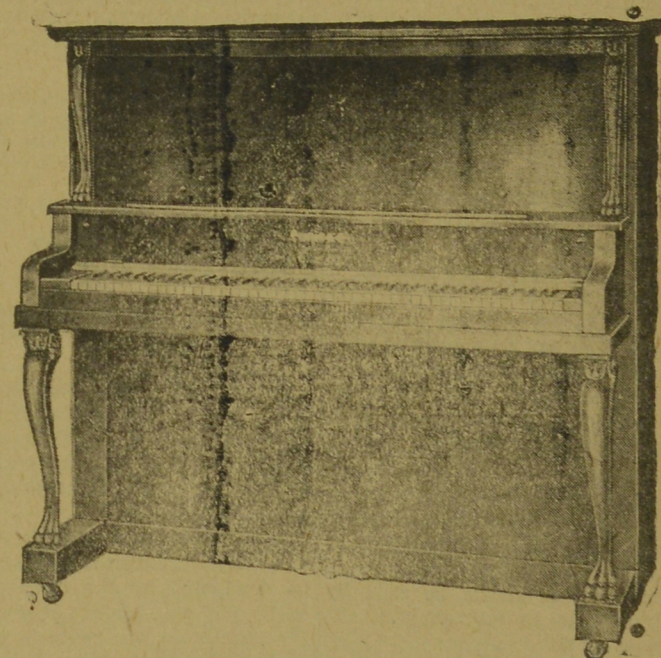
