HALIFAX MATCH

Halifax Horse Won in Two Straight Heats—Best Time of Race Was 2:14 1-4—Other classes

Halifax, June 21—Three thousand persons witnessed the horse races on the exhibition track this afternoon. The match race for \$10,000 between the Halifax pacer, Rex Heart, and Bob Mac, owned in Cape Breton, was won by the Halifax horse in two straight heats. The first heat was in 2:19 and the second in 2:14. In this heat Bob Mac acted badly at the half and was distanced.

The 2:25 trot and pace was won by Cochoato Lady in straight heats with Addie B. second. The best time was 2:22.

FAVORITES HAD BAD
DAY AT WOONSOCKET

Woonsocket, R.I., June 20—Splendid racing marked the opening day of the Bay State Short Ship Circuit here this afternoon, there being a contest in every heat of the fourteen sent away by Starter Albert H. Merrill.

It was a bad day for the favorites. J. Forbes, selected as the best bet in the 2:17 trot, finished last in a field of six horses. Josephine Watts, who went a great race at Framingham last week, landed fourth money in the Roger Williams trotting stake, and Bud Elliott, picked to win the 2:17 pace, finished second.

Evan Williams carried off the honors in the 2:27 trot after five heats.

"HEINIE" WAGNER
EX-BIG LEAGUER LET
OUT BY HARTFORD

Old-Time Star has Struck The Toboggan—Batting Poorly, Leading Hartford Club in weak Style

Hartford, Conn., June 20—Charles "Heinie" Wagner, famous as a member of the World Champion Boston Red Sox, was released as manager and player of the Hartford club of the Eastern League by Owner James H. Clarkin after today's game.

The action had been under consideration by the local owner for two weeks and was taken as a result of Hartford's loss of today's game to Springfield in the eleventh inning, after Hartford had been in the lead at the close of the seventh, 4 to 2.

Owner Clarkin maintained that Wagner has failed as a pilot. He has been out of one-third of the games because of bad legs, he says, and has hit for only .150, less than he ever did while a member of the majors.

Clarkin claims he has a tendency to leave weakening pitchers in against opposing clubs with Hartford holding the lead and that it has lost at least five games within three weeks.

Webb Crowther, a former Hartford player, last season manager of Bellows Falls in the Twin State League, has been secured to fill the place in the infield. Wagner's successor as manager will not be named until the close of the week.

WOLGAST FOULED AND
LOST BOUT TO DONNELLY

Richmond, Ind., June 20—Stewart Donnelly, Indianapolis, won his fight from Ad Wolgast on a foul. At the conclusion of the third round, after the bell rang, Wolgast hit Donnelly low, sending him to the floor writhing in pain. The referee is not allowed to give any decision, but at the end of the one-minute rest he ordered both men out of the ring. Donnelly was not seriously hurt.

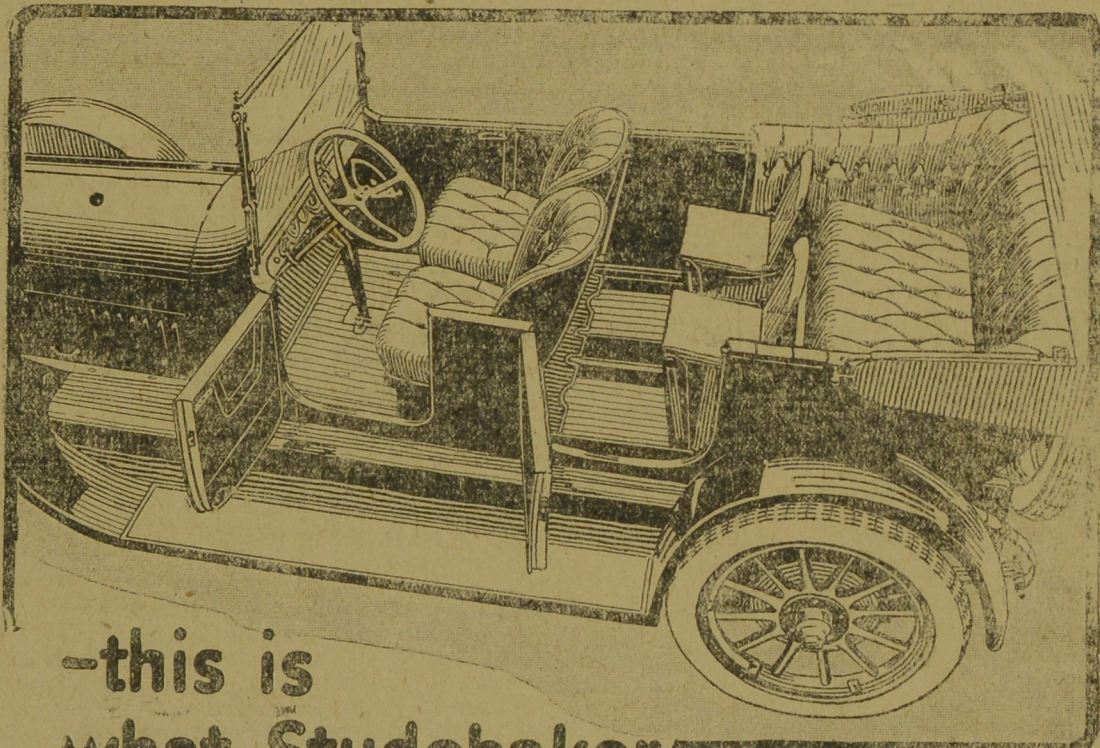

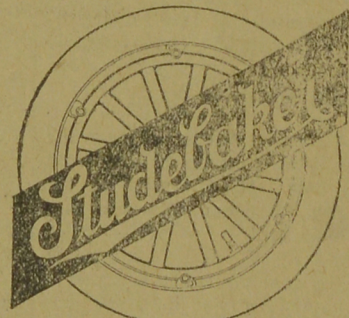
