PTE. JAMES G. LAWRIE
OF FREDERICTON
WOUNDED IN WRIST

Left With First Contingent--Third Time He Has Been on Casualty List-- Stanley Man Died of Wounds.

Mrs. Lottie Lawrie this morning received an official telegram from Ottawa informing her that No. 22,538 Private James G. Lawrie, had been admitted to No. 13 General Hospital at Boulogne on June 13, suffering from a gunshot wound in the wrist. Private Lawrie is Mrs. Lawrie's stepson. He left Fredericton in August, 1913, with the first draft from the 71st York Regt. and joined the 12th Battalion at Valcartier. After that corps reached England he was drafted with a battalion from Western Canada, which had gained glory in the first fight in which the Canadians were engaged.

Private Lawrie has been in the casualty list on two previous occasions. The first time he was struck in the fleshy part of the arm. The next time he experienced the German gas and was in hospital three weeks as a result. He will be twenty-two years of age in August.

Stanley Man Dies.

This morning's casualty list contains the name of William Best of Stanley, who is reported died of wounds. Private Best had been in the trenches for several months.

MANGANESE DISCOVERED IN THE
PARISH OF DOUGLAS

Find of Valuable Mineral Deposits Causes Excitement--An American Mining Engineer Secures the Right to Search.

Some excitement has been caused at Douglas by the discovery in that section of what is believed to be valuable deposits of manganese. The find was made in the vicinity of Gardner Creek, about a mile from the settlement. The ore is cropping out of the ground and there is said to be lots of it.

An American mining engineer visited the locality last week with a party of friends and after looking over the deposits and procuring samples proceeded to the Crown Land Office and took out a license to search over a territory of forty-eight square miles. He is backed by ample capital and it is said will at once take steps for the development of the property.

It is said that the most valuable deposits of manganese have been found on property owned by Mr. Murray Scott.

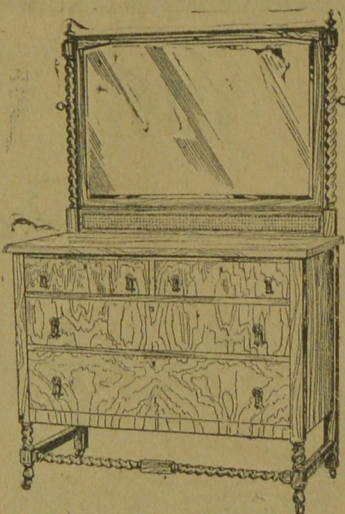
