HOUSEHOLD HELPS.

A glass lemon squeezer is the safest kind to use.

The most effectual bait for a rat trap is old cheese.

Grown-ups stockings will make excellent tight for the tiny girl.

If the finger nails are brittle, hold them in warm sweet oil every day.

Alcohol can always be used instead of cleaning fluids, and it leaves no ring around the spot.

Linseed oil, turpentine and a Japanese dryer make a very good oil to use on hardwood floors.

Always remove mildew as quickly as possible. The longer it remains the more difficult it will be.

Linens always should be soaked a long time before washing; the stains will come out more thoroughly.

Rub the ends of the ribs of the umbrella where they are fastened with vaseline. This prevents rust.

The faded rug can be brightened by wiping it all over with a cloth wrung out of warm water and ammonia.

No dishes can be clean and bright unless the towels with which they are wiped are washed and scalded every day.

It is a great mistake to buy household articles that there is no actual need for, because they are presented as bargains.

If you would keep materials from slipping off the sewing machine, slip an old pillow case over the leaf of the sewing machine.

A little salt added to the bluing water in which white clothes are rinsed will prevent the bluing from settling in spots.

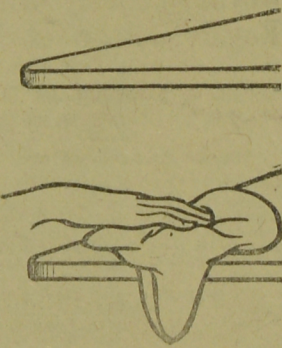
An old pocketbook will look like new if rubbed with beaten white of egg, then polished with beeswax and turpentine.

ALMOND CAKES.

Beat 3 eggs light, add 1 cup of sugar; beat again, add 1-2 cup almonds, cut small, 1 teaspoonful vanilla flavoring, 2 1-2 cups sifted flour with 2 heaping teaspoons baking powder, beat smooth, put onto a well floured board, and with the hands roll lightly into balls the size of a walnut; place in a well-greased shallow pan and bake in a quick oven. Lake Steamers For Atlantic Trade

Sarnia, Ont., Nov. 20.—The steamer Royalite and the steamer Locolite, of the Imperial Oil fleet, will leave in the near future for the Atlantic Ocean, where they will be engaged in the oil trade during the coming winter.

It is expected that they will carry oil from Halifax to other points on the Atlantic, and will return to the Lakes in the spring. They will take a cargo from here to Montreal on their last trip.

PLENTY OF TRAFFIC FOR C. G. RAILWAYS

Ottawa, Nov. 20.—Arrangements for the despatch of overseas traffic by the Canadian Government Railways were considered at a conference between Hon. Frank Cochrane and F. P. Gutelius, general manager of the system.

Big business is looked for, as the British government has the road and is prepared to handle a hundred thousand tons of freight a month. In addition there will be a large movement of troops.

The road is well equipped with rolling stock and expects to be fully equal to the task. Mr. Gutelius stated today that the Transcontinental has had a satisfactory season's business, the volume of traffic east bound by the National Express being equal to that of the Maritime Express on the Intercolonial.

PUSHING THE APPAM CASE.

U. S. Supreme Court Asked to Advance the Hearing of the Case.

Washington, Nov. 20.—Counsel for British interests today asked the Supreme Court to advance for earlier hearing cases to decide ownership of the German prize steamer Appam, and whether European citizens may enforce contracts in American courts which are suspended by belligerent "trading with the enemy" decrees.

Decisions upon the motions are expected December 4th.

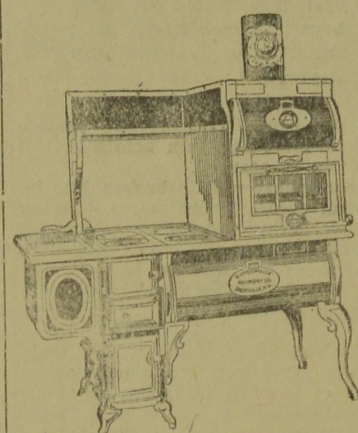
