All the men soon recovered from their indisposition, but one of the number, Arthur Craig, was for a time in a critical condition. The names of the men who were on the sick list temporarily are: Adam Willette, Clarence Fudge, Wm. Downey, Bert Inman, Carlton McGuire, Lee Finnamore, Murchie Barr and Arthur Craig.

The day was exceedingly hot, and while the excessive drinking of river water may have contributed to the men's illness, the main cause is said to have been some beef which may have become tainted by the high temperature. Whatever the cause, it was a close call for some of the men, who

hereafter will go easy on the meat during hot weather.

MEMORIAL TO FALLEN DOMINION SOLDIERS

London, July 29.—A meeting yesterday of well known men representing all the overseas dominions inaugurated a movement for the erection in London of a memorial to fallen Dominion soldiers and for securing a cemetery in London for interment of the remains of overseas men who die in England. JIM WAS AHEAD OF HIM.

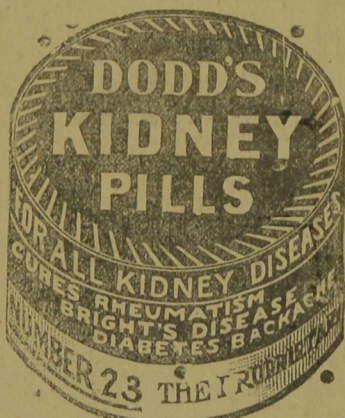

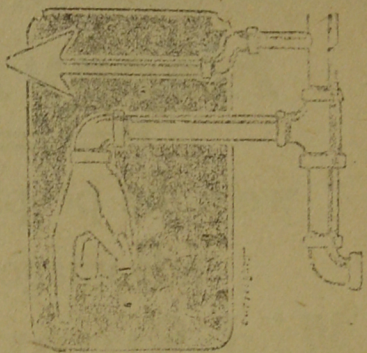

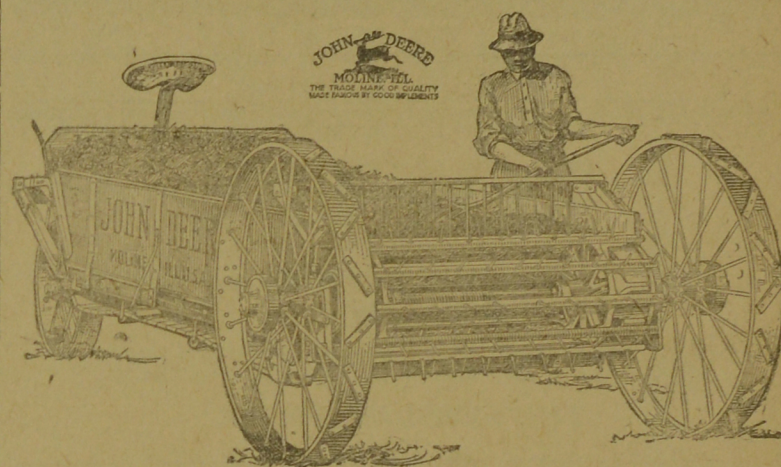
