## ADVANCE IN PRICE OF BISCUITS

## THE FISHING SEASON.

A few salmon were offered for sale in the country market this morning and brought twenty cents per pound. A few shad have been taken in the river by net fishermen and a big run is expected next week.

A few salmon have already been taken with fly at the Harri's Island pool this season, although the water continues quite high. Mr. Harry G. Chestnut is said to have been the lucky fisherman and it is said established a record for early fly fishing in the St. John River.

## GOLDEN JUBILEE.

The fiftieth anniversary of the ordination of Rt. Rev. Mgr. Doyle, P. P., D.P., Milltown, falls on Thursday, June 25. After consultation with His Lordship, Bishop LeBlanc, Monsignor Doyle has decided to hold the celebration on Wednesday, July 5. This will be a more convenient date for the Ordinary as well as for the priests of the diocese to be in attendance.

## THE COUNTRY MARKET.

There was a fair sized country market this morning and as usual, good prices prevailed. Dairy butter brought 30 cents per pound and eggs sold at 23 and 25 cents a dozen. Veal was plentiful at 8 and 10 cents a pound. Potatoes sold at 33 per barrel and seemed to be plentiful. Rhubarb brought 5 cents per pound. Turnips were in rather slow demand at 50 cents per barrel.

## UNDERSIZED TROUT.

A man from Nashwaak had a quantity of brook trout for sale in the market this morning. There seemed to be quite a demand for them until Fishery Inspector Harrison came along and put a stop to the sale. Many of the fish were under the legal size and the inspector told the man that he had no right to offer them for sale. Most of the purchasers were men who sometimes go fishing.

## JOINS IN ASSIGNMENT.

St. John Times—Mrs. Sarah E. Smith, widow of A. C. Smith, has joined with H. Colby Smith in the assignment for benefit of creditors A. C. Smith & Company. At a meeting of the creditors some of them maintained that they had dealt with the firm on the understanding that Mrs. Smith was a partner. In order that there might be no grounds for dissatisfaction and acting on the advice of her solicitors, Mrs. Smith decided to join in the assignment.

## THE ST. JOHN RIVER.

Mr. T. C. L. Ketchum of Woodstock, contributes an interesting and able article on the St. John River to the current number of the Canadian Magazine. He dwells on the beauties of the section of country served by the Valley Railway and calls attention to its wonderful attractions for tourists. Mr. Ketchum rejoices that some of the Indian names such as Pokioik, Meductic and Shogomoc have been retained by the railway but regrets that Aupeque, a once famous Indian village located near what is now the Jardine farm at Springhill, has no place in the time table. The nearest station to Aupeque is called Cherry Bank and the one just above it is Island View. Aupeque was omitted because the parties whose duty it was to name the stations were poorly versed in Indian folklore.

Private F. W. Golden Wetmore Late of Woodstock Writes Interesting Letter--Former Fredericton Men Are Near Him.

Mr. Thomas W. Rainsford is in receipt of an interesting letter from Private F. W. Golden Wetmore, now a member of the Substaff, 8th Infantry Brigade, 3rd Canadian Division. The letter was written from France on May 15 and mentions two former Fredericton men, Rainsford Winslow and D'Arcy McGrath, who were serving near the writer. The latter is well known in Fredericton. He is a cousin of Mr. Rainsford and attended the U.N.B. a few years ago, taking a degree in civil engineering in 1908. He was employed at Woodstock, near which town he resided, on the construction of the St. John & Quebec Railway. He enlisted at Woodstock in the 6th Mounted Rifles transferring into an infantry battalion.

Extracts from the letter are as follows:

"By the way in the next dugout to the one I am in is Lieut. Rains Winslow and one of the sergeants is doctor. I am a private in an infantry battalion yet. We got such a D'Arcy McGrath, brother of the raw deal on the Mounted Rifle staff that I got disgusted. I did my best to get into the artillery from Valcartier to here and now but they would not listen to a transfer. Also I was a corporal and would have been a sergeant now if I had continued, but my two stripes stood in the way of my transfer, so I fired

Burton Holmes. Well Known "Travelogue" Lecturer, Coming Here June 12--Wants Material Re U. E. Loyalists.

Mr. J. M. Gibbon of Montreal, general publicity agent of the Canadian Pacific Railway, has written to Mr. F. B. Edgcombe to inform him that he expected to be in Fredericton on June 12, with Mr. Burton Holmes, who is well known throughout the United States as a lecturer. 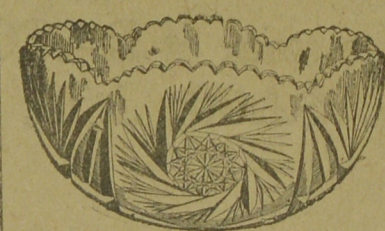
