HINTS ABOUT BLOUSES.

The peplum blouse is making a determined fight for life, despite the fact that separate skirt designers have seen fit to ignore its existence and have equipped all of the skirts with some sort of a belt or girdle, making the wearing of a peplum blouse depend upon considerable skirt alterations if a ready-to-wear garment is selected. The peplum blouse is undeniably smart and very becoming to a slight figure.

Georgette continues to lead the procession of preferred blouse fabrics, although some very beautiful silks are also being pressed into service. Some tailored models of Roman striped silks are noted.

Blouses of the slip-over type are

noted with increasing frequency, and the greatest possible variety is observed in the placing of openings. Some fasten frankly in the front or back, others at the shoulder and under arm, and an invisible fastening that simulates a slip-over effect is also approved.

Nearly all of the smartest blouses have full-length sleeves, although elbow and three-quarter-length sleeves still have their adherents.

Collars may be high all around, the blouse may be simply collarless showing a round neck, or a high back.

RECIPES WORTH TRYING.

Steamed Rice Pudding.
Heat 3 cups of milk in a double

boiler. Cook 1-2 cup of rice in 1 cup boiling water 5 minutes. Add to hot milk and cook until rice is tender, then add 1-2 teaspoon salt. Beat 1 egg light, add 2 tablespoons sugar and stir this into hot rice just as you take it from the fire. When well mixed, turn into serving dish, sprinkle 2 tablespoons of sugar over top and dot with 1 heaping tablespoon of butter cut into small pieces. Allow about 1 1/2 hours to cook.

Bologna Sausage.

Boil fresh beef until tender, chop finely and season with a little cayenne (red pepper), black pepper table salt and, if liked, a little ground cloves may be added. Put in a cloth case (narrow tube of cotton cloth) to form. Slice off with sharp knife, remove rings of cloth and serve for luncheon or supper.

ROUMANIANS HAVE TAKEN THE OFFENSIVE

London, Nov. 6.—After a week or more of doubt concerning the operations in the Dobruja region of Roumania, where the forces of the Teutonic allies had been marching almost unimpeded northward across the province, from the Black Sea to the Danube, comes the report that the Roumanians have now taken the offensive, probably aided by Russians, and compelled the Teutonic allies to retreat at several points.

On the Transylvanian front, however, the Roumanians in the Jiu Valley, who for some time had been holding the upper hand, have now been stopped, the Teutons having brought up reinforcements. In the Predel Pass, after heavy fighting, the Roumanians also have met with a reverse, being compelled to retreat after long and stubborn battles.

Rome reports that the Austrians are bringing up heavy reinforcements on the battlefield north of Trieste. Here the Austrians apparently have taken the offensive, but nowhere have they been able to regain any of their lost positions.

Bombardments and small infantry attacks continue to feature the fighting in Macedonia.

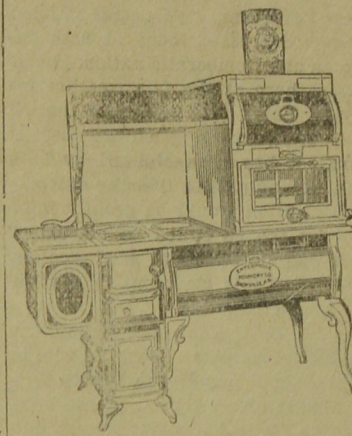

Tuberculosis Rapidly Increasing Among Children of Belgium and Northern France.

More Food Urgently Needed to Keep up Their Strength

An interview with Mr. W. L. Honnold, American Director of the Belgian Relief Commission, brings to light a new danger threatening the population of the territory occupied by Germany.

Mr. Honnold reports that about 5,000,000 wholly or partially destitute people, who have been dependent on the Commission, generally show diminished vitality. The effects are most apparent among the older children, particularly those in the adolescent stage. Among these there is an alarming increase of tuberculosis, due to the lower power of resistance consequent on an inadequate diet.

To overcome this serious danger, the Commission appeals for extra contributions so that a special meal can be served every day in the schools. Efforts are also being made to provide as far as possible for children outside the schools.

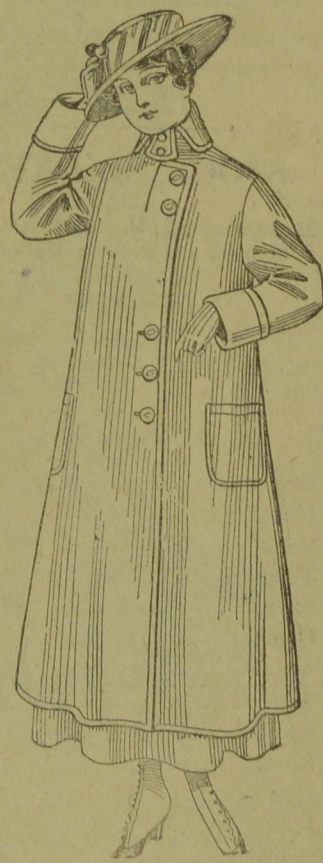
