KENTUCKY BREEDERS

BREAK AWAY FROM THE
NATIONAL TROTTING ASSO.

Breach Began About a Year Ago and Steadily Widened--Fall Meets, Under New Rules.

Lexington, Ky., May 11—The Kentucky Trotting Horse Breeders' Association has withdrawn from the National Trotting Association and has announced that the fall trots will be conducted under the rules of the American Trotting Association. The question of change has been agitated for some time and was decided by the directors today in the offices of President Ed A. Tipton at the track.

The breach began about a year ago. Recently R. C. Estill of Lexington, William Allen Russell of Pittsfield, Mass.; Horatio N. Bain of Poughkeepsie, N.Y., and J. O. Winston of Richmond, Va., resigned as directors of the National Board. This is held to indicate dissension in the ranks.

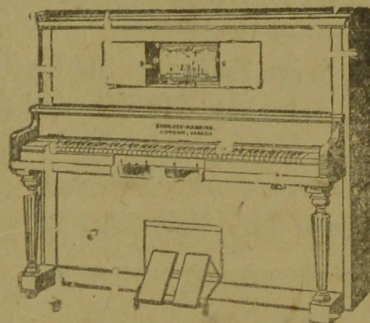

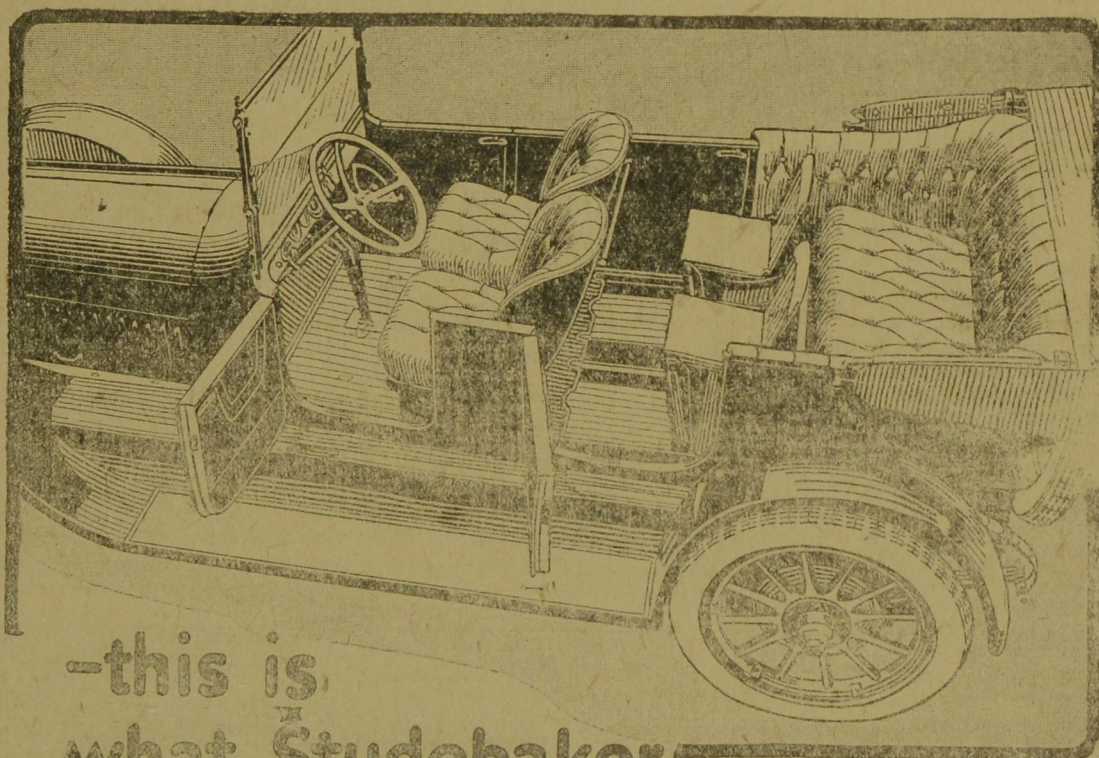

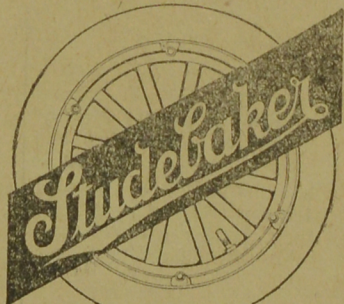
