BARN BURNED LAST NIGHT AT NASHWAAKSIS

Miah Willis Meets With Heavy Loss-- Cause of the Fire Unknown.

Mr. Miah Willis, of Nashwaaksis, met with a heavy loss last night when his barn was totally destroyed by fire. The origin of the fire is unknown. Mr. Willis's attention was attracted at about 9.30 by the kicking of his horse, which was stabled in the barn. He went to the building and found it in flames. He had not been in the barn since sundown, and as far as known no other person had been there.

He was successful in getting out his horse, cow and pigs, but lost quantities of hay and oats and also sleds and sleighs which had been stored until winter. His loss will be upwards of \$1,000.

The fire was very spectacular and could be seen for miles. Many went from Fredericton by motor to the scene of the fire.

FORTY-NINE MEN TRANSFERRED TO KILTIES

Arrived This Morning From Valcartier - Eighteen Volunteers Yesterday.

Forty-nine men transferred from the Special Service Battalion at Valcartier, arrived here this morning to join the Special Service Company of the 236th Highlanders. Sergt. Hunt, who formerly served in the Royal Navy, was in charge of the party.

Two more recruits for the 236th were enrolled here yesterday and this morning. They are Thomas Onions, 18, of Stanley, and Arthur Waugh, 26, Fredericton.

The recruiting campaign is being continued. Eighteen volunteers were secured yesterday. Ten of that number were secured at the Restigouche Boom, near Campbellton, by Lieut. A. A. Gillies. They will come in after rafting operations are completed. Restigouche is now leading among the 15 counties.

HORSE KICKS BOY WITH FATAL RESULT

Salisbury, N. B., Oct. 6.—Gernie Douthright, ten-year-old son of Mr. and Mrs. Aaron Douthright, of Colpitts, Albert county, was killed this week. He was leading one of his father's horses to water on Wednesday evening, when the animal in play kicked the boy.

The little chap was fatally injured and died at an early hour the following morning.

SOLDIER FIRED REVOLVER.

Private Morris, of the 236th Battalion, generally known among his comrades as "the tattooed man," was arrested last night by the military police assisted by the civil police. Morris had a revolver containing two empty shells in his possession when captured. He fired two shots while about the streets early in the evening. He probably will have that charge against him as well as one of being drunk. He is now in the cells at the guard house, and will be dealt with by the military authorities.

James Howie, son of the late J. Robt. Howie, of this city, enlisted yesterday for the 9th Siege Battery. He will go to St. John to join his unit.


SUSPENDS REGULAR SAILINGS.
