HALLOWE'EN FESTIVITIES.


Three Young Men Arrested But Allowed Out on Deposits of \$8.

Hallowe'en passed off more or less quietly. Three young men were arrested on the charge of creating a disturbance and yelling and shouting on the street. The disorder was generally confined to the West End. Fences about the Old Government House property were torn down and doorsteps and gates of residences removed. Young men residing in the West End are said to be responsible for the most of the damage.

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SIR SAM HUGHES' POWERS HAVE BEEN CURTAILED

Sir George Perley Has Been Appointed Overseas Minister of Militia and Will Form His Own Army Council--Sir Sam's Pets Who are now Holding Down Soft Jobs in England May be Hustled off to the Front.

Ottawa, Nov. 1.—Sir George Perley, now acting as Canada's High Commissioner in London, has been appointed Canada's overseas minister of militia. By the end of this month there will be fully 275,000 Canadian troops at the front or in England, and the bulk of Canada's militia work must be done there.

Sir George Perley will be given authority to form his own army council in London and direct all affairs pertaining to Canada's soldiers outside of those coming under the Allied commands. Such an appointment has been rumored for some days, but only last week Sir Sam Hughes said he had not heard of it.

New Council to be Named.

Sir Robert Borden's memorandum to the press announcing the turning over of authority to Sir George Perley lets the Minister of Militia down as easily as possible under the circumstances, but it is apparent that the move is the culminating effort of Sir Sam's enemies in the government ranks to shear him of all real authority and initiative as minister of war.

When Sir Sam was in England last August he appointed his own overseas militia council and deputy minister to handle Canadian military affairs across the Atlantic. His appointments were never ratified by order-in-council here, and now it is announced Sir George Perley is to appoint a new advisory council and take charge of the whole overseas work.

The purchase of all munitions is under the control of the war purchasing commission. The recruiting efforts are henceforth to be practically controlled by the National Service Commission. The routine of administrative detail and patronage is largely in the hands of F. B. McCurdy, parliamentary secretary for the Militia Department.

There is not much of importance left to the Minister of Militia, Lieut. General Sir Sam Hughes. Whether he will tamely submit to the new order of things or hit back and public resent the "treachery" of his cabinet colleagues remains to be seen. Sir Sam knows a lot about the inside political workings of the government since the outbreak of the war, and he is in no mood to allow himself to be quietly

though decorously shelved. Some "fireworks" are predicted before long.

On the other hand the cabinet majority holds that the clipping of Sir Sam's wings is absolutely necessary if the doctrine of joint cabinet responsibility and harmony within the ranks are to be preserved. Sir Sam had a habit of doing things off his own bat and then consulting the cabinet afterwards. Also he was not at all amenable to the demands of his cabinet colleagues in regard to patronage considerations or team play. Consequently his constitutional powers have now been divided up.

Likely to be a Change.

When parliament meets an elucidation will be asked by the Opposition. As a result of Sir George Perley's appointment as overseas minister of militia, it is likely there will be a considerable shake-up in the Canadian staff in England. Sir Sam's personal friends hold most of the jobs now. It is asserted that several score of Canadian officers holding staff appointments in England will be asked to go to the front while their places will be taken by men who have seen active service or who are physically unfitted for the hardships of life at the front.

SIR GEO. PERLEY'S NEW POST.

Minister of Canadian Overseas Forces in Great Britain.



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
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
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
