## THE POLICE COMMISSION HANDS OUT ITS REPORT

(Continued from page 1.)

Dear Sirs,—I, the undersigned, do hereby tender you my resignation as Chief of Police of the City of Fredericton, to take effect on the 31st day of July instant.

In tendering you this resignation, there are a few things that I would like to say:

First.—The thoughtless citizens, the notoriety hunters and the class ever at war with decent government, are also ever at war with the police who endeavor to enforce the law with fairness and impartiality. Because of the presence of the police, and because I have neither been purchased nor purchasable by vice or crime promoters, our city and rural districts, wherever the police patrol, are safer than in any other community in the world. Fredericton's police force, smaller than it ought to be, has nevertheless a record to be proud of, and sensational notoriety hunters, ignorant of the facts, at times in reality angry because certain of their friends have been found out and prosecuted, decry the police force and the Police Commissioners and other guardians of the people's welfare.

The public generally know that behind all this is some mean personal spite, and the desire to be thought the one and only individual who can attack judges and police. These appeals are never listened to in patience by the law-abiding citizens. They are only endorsed by the thoughtless, by the

vice defenders, the criminals and the people who are on the verge of crime or vice. The sensational trades of some of these people are responsible for driving some people to vice and others to crime.

Second.—Efficient police administration can only be secured through a capable head who has been trained in the police business and whose sympathies are with law enforcement in all its phases and who, understanding his duty, has the courage to do it regardless of the selfish interests ever about him and ready to use him for the advancement of their personal ends.

Third.—Since taking up my duties as Chief of Police, I have at all times tried to do my duty and at all times I have given to the city and citizens the best that was in me. I have tried to be fair to all and I think that the condition of the city today can compare favorably with any other city in Canada or the United States.

I am leaving you for a larger field of operations, and in doing so I can only say that I wish you the best of the best.

In closing, I want to thank this Commission, Police Magistrate and all the officials of the City of Fredericton for their kindness and assistance to me during my holding office as Chief of Police.

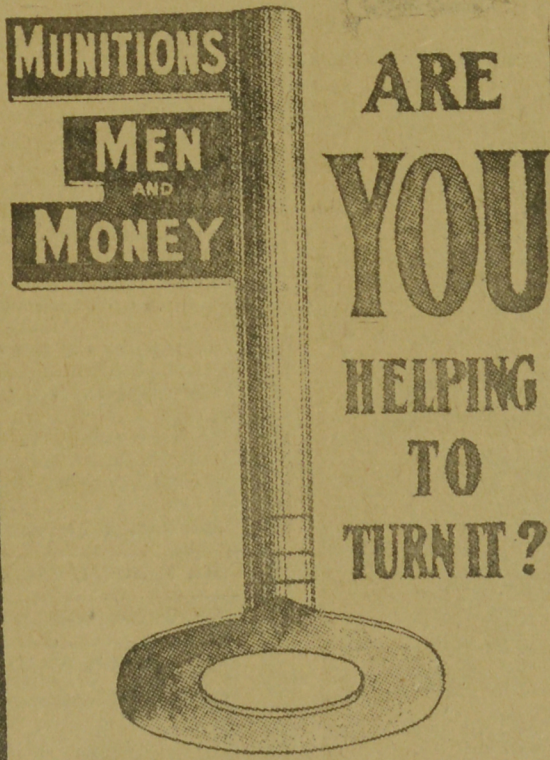
