French Troops Have Thrown Back Huns On the Northwest of Dead Man's Hill

PARIS, May 5 .- The French successes on the left bank of the Meuse have been of greater importance than indicated by first reports, according to a semi-official statement issued last night. The French troops, by a skilfully prepared and brilliantly executed operation, have thrown back the Germans on the northwest side of Dead Man Hill, beyond the line held at the beginning of March. The enemy has lost by a single stroke his gains painfully made by two months of continuous and costly attacks. Dead Man's Hill has twin summits, known respectively as Hills 265 and 295. On the first of these the Germans had effected a footing, but now have been completely cleared. The Germans, surprised by the suddenness of the French attack, were thrown back in disorder and suffered exceptionally heavy losses, particularly from the preliminary bombardemnt. The large number of Germans killed explains why so few prisoners were taken.
