### Lord Northcliffe Says That Spain is Completely Overrun With Hun Agents

LONDON, Sept. 12.—Lord Northcliffe, recording in the Times his impressions of Spain, derived from a visit to that country, says there are 60,000 German agents in Spain, all of them constantly busy flooding the country with propaganda matter. The chief methods of the propaganda, he says "seem to be daily streams of wireless despatches from Berlin and Austria, discrediting the Allies and continuous activity on the part of the German colony, university professors on behalf of the Central powers, the chief channel being the press."

### APPEAL COURT GAVE JUDGEMENT AGAINST BYRNE

Howes Appeal Will Not be Heard Till  
Next Term--Continues  
Tomorrow.

The Appeal Court met this morning, and Chief Justice McLeod delivered judgment in the case of Byrne vs. the Town of Chatham, re the sale of real estate for taxes. His Honor decided in favor of the Town of Chatham.

The King vs. Limerick, ex parte Ernest Howes, did not come up, as the return of the papers had not been made. This case will come up at the next sitting of the Appeal Court. Much interest is taken in this case as it is the first appeal under the amended Canada Temperance Act.

The case of R. F. Randolph and Allan Randolph, doing business under the name of A. F. Randolph & Sons, against Peter Grossman and his wife Fannie Grossman, of Chatham, in an action to set aside a deed of Peter Grossman and wife to R. A. Lawlor, and an injunction to restrain the conveyance of R. A. Lawlor to Fannie Grossman, was also heard. R. B. Hanson appeared for the plaintiffs and Mr. Ring, of Weldon & McLean, appeared for defendants. On hearing the solicitors, the court considers.

Tomorrow morning at 10 o'clock the Appeal Court will sit before Justices McLeod, White and Grimmer.

## GREAT GENERAL STRIKE IN NEW YORK UNLIKELY

New York, Sept. 12.—The danger of a great general strike to help enforce the demands of the striking traction employees, seemed remote today in view of the statement that the only unions likely to be involved in such a movement were those directly concerned with the operations of street cars.

Hugh Frayne, state organizer for the American Federation of Labor, who made this assertion, said that if a sympathetic strike were called, it probably would not involve more than 60,000 workers. In this class he named engineers, firemen, longshoremen and teamsters.

Panama, Sept. 8.—With a crew of one man aboard, the forty foot sailing launch, Sir Francis, bound from San Diego, Cal., for the St. Lawrence river, cleared from Colon today for Jamaica and Key West.

Berlin, Sept. 10.—Halil Bey, Turkish minister of the interior, arrived here today from Constantinople for a conference with German officials.

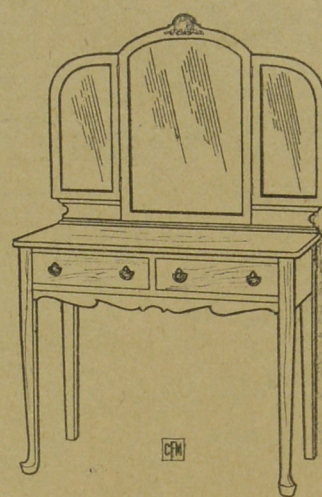

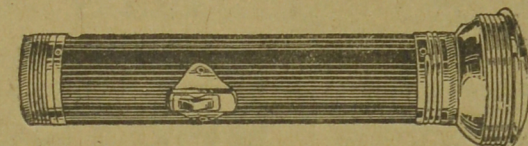
