Miss Kathryn Gallivan as Mrs. Hunter was seen in a good comedy part. Mrs. Herbert Mayes as Miss Ruth Hunter had a strong part and portrayed it excellently. The other ladies in minor roles gave an excellent support.

The specialties between the acts were well received, particularly the solos of Miss Gallivan and Mr. W. D. Pidgeon.

The play was staged under the able direction of Mrs. A. C. Wilson, of St. John, while Mr. J. J. McCaffrey, of the Queen Hotel, was most energetic in looking after the business end of it.



### GOLF AND BASE BALLS TO COST MORE

Chicago, Nov. 29.—Base balls will cost from 10 to 50 per cent. more next season than last, depending upon the market price of the materials, so local sporting goods dealers announced today. It was also announced that the price of golf clubs will be advanced from 30 to 50 per cent. next season.

The general manager of a large sporting goods house compiled figures to show that certain material entering into the manufacture of baseballs and golf clubs have increased in price from 60 to 400 per cent. within the year.



### NEW MILITIA MINISTER STARTS ELECTION MILL

Arrives in Toronto and Meets His Party Workers---Taking no Chances.

"Tory Toronto" is at last getting some nominal return for her long allegiance to Conservatism, according to the frankly expressed views of local party stalwarts on the ensuing East Toronto by-election. The appointment of Hon. A. E. Kemp as Minister of Militia gives to this city no less than three cabinet ministers, an unprecedented allotment. Sir Thomas White, of course, sits for Leeds, but his home is in Toronto, while Sir Geo. Foster and Hon. Mr. Kemp have represented Toronto seats.

Hon. Mr. Kemp secured his appointment because, his associates say, a Toronto seat involving a regular majority in the thousands is the only seat that Premier Borden dare jeopardize at the present time. So the post of Minister of Militia goes to Mr. Kemp in what has hitherto been deemed a "safe" Conservative seat. In the last election of 1911 Mr. Kemp's majority was 4,801.

Nothing, however, is taken for granted by the Borden government these days, and the organization, both at Ottawa and in the city, is already getting busy.

When the new Minister arrived from Ottawa on Saturday he was met by a crowd and a brass band at the station and during the afternoon at a meeting of Ward 1 Conservatives in the Oddfellows' Hall, he formally started his campaign.

In his address Mr. Kemp appealed for unanimity of effort. He was confident of victory, he stated.

### MORE SCHOOL ACCOMMODATION IS NEEDED

Matter Was Considered at Monthly Meeting of School Trustees--Financial Matters

At the monthly meeting of the School Board, held yesterday, it was reported that owing to the prevalence of measles in the city, the attendance of pupils at some of the schools during November was most discouraging to the teachers. Another drawback to satisfactory term work has been the discovery of diphtheria cases among the children attending three different city schools this month. The trustees have been most watchful in their efforts to prevent the spread of this dread disease. That something is doing was shown by the secretary when he submitted sundry big bills for formaldehyde. At the Charlotte street school much activity has been shown in the endeavor to introduce the several preventative improvements recommended by the Board of Health and the sanitary expert brought here by the trustees.

A large part of yesterday's session was taken up with financial matters, it having been found absolutely necessary to at once make provision for increased school accommodation. Some of the schools have too many pupils registered to expect the teacher to cover the curriculum or prepare the children for grading; at the same time new applications for permits are received by the Secretary, and in many cases he is in a quandary as to where to place them, and the teacher wonders if she will ever again preside over the nice little school she had "before the war." After some weeks of careful study the Trustees seem to have arrived at the conclusion that the most feasible and economical plan is to erect an addition to the present Charlotte Street School building, and the Building Committee, which is composed of the chairman of the Board, Mr. Hughes, Mr. Weddall, Mr. Shute and Mr. Lemont, will at an early date make full enquiries respecting details, and report back.

Arrangements were made for the presentation of the Lieut. Governor's High School entrance medal. The winner for York county is Master Darrell Phillips, and Rev. Thomas Marshall will be invited to make the presentation at the Christmas closing.

Many other matters were disposed of before adjournment.

### NEW GOVERNOR OF N. S.

Ottawa, Nov. 30.—The appointment of J. MacCallum Grant as Lieutenant Governor of Nova Scotia, in succession to the late Hon. David McKeen, was made officially today. The new Governor is prominent in financial and industrial circles in Halifax, and is an intimate friend of the Prime Minister. The clerk of the Privy Council is leaving for Halifax to administer the oath of office.
