N. B. SHOULD BUILD WOODEN SHIPS

Toronto Man Thinks Revival of Industry Would Mean Great Prosperity

Mr. H. H. Blanchet, representing the Canada Metal Company, is among the visitors to the city today. Mr. Blanchet is a firm believer in a big merchant marine for Canada, and is doing all in his power, by pen and voice, to bring about such a consummation. He says that wooden ships are being built in Nova Scotia shipyards today and there is no reason why there should not be something doing in this line in New Brunswick. "Why," said Mr. Blanchet, "a sailing ship today can almost make sufficient in one voyage to pay for herself. I am doing all I can to interest the moneyed men of this province in shipbuilding, and I believe there are men over north ready to take hold of the work if the Federal Government will give them some encouragement. There should be a boom in wooden ship building in this province, and it should start at once. It is up to your municipal councils and boards of trade to give this matter their attention. Why should not New Brunswick have a merchant marine worthy of one of the largest maritime provinces of Canada, and thus be in a position to share in the immense foreign trade which is sure to come when the war is ended?"

Aube was 27 years of age and stood 6 feet 2 inches in height.

JOHN KILBURN SR. DIED AT AN ADVANCED AGE

One of York County's Pioneers--Interment at Macin-quac.

The death of John Kilburn, Sr., occurred at his home, Northumberland street Sunday afternoon at four o'clock. The deceased was aged ninety-four years and six months, and was one of the oldest residents of the county of York. He was a pioneer of this county, a man of sterling quality, respected by the men of his time, a man who started life at the bottom and by industry became one of the independent farmers of the county in which he lived. The deceased was a native of Kingsclear, but resided in Maciniquac during the greater part of his life.

Four sons and two daughters survive. The sons are Dr. Frank Kilburn, of Presque Isle, Me., H. B. Kilburn, of Port Fairfield, Me., R. E. Kilburn, of Montana, and A. E. Kilburn, of Fredericton, with whom the deceased made his home. The daughters are Mrs. W. White, of Nashwaak, and Mrs. C. R. Gunter, of Fredericton. Mr. John Kilburn, of this city, is a nephew of the deceased. "One sister, Mrs. E. S. Hammond, of Kingsclear, also survives.

A service will be conducted at eight o'clock tonight at the residence of Mr. A. E. Kilburn. Interment will be made at Maciniquac tomorrow afternoon with service in the church at one o'clock.

SUCCESSFUL RAIDS BY BRITISH TROOPS

London, Oct. 30.—British troops last night made two raids on the German trenches to the west of Wytslaete, in Belgium, and east of Boesinghe, says the official statement issued this afternoon by the War Office.

A number of prisoners were taken.

Ottawa, Oct. 30.—General Sir Sam Hughes intends to do a bit of recruiting work in the province of Quebec. He said today that he will shortly visit the principal centres of this and other provinces, and assist in plans of organization, but no dates are yet available. Incidentally he will deliver a number of public addresses.

The General believes there are plenty of men in Quebec who can be got if they are properly gone after.

FIFTY AMERICANS ON THE MARINA

Newport News, W. Va., Oct. 20.—There were fifty Americans on board the British steamer Marine, reported torpedoed without warning in today's despatches from London, when she sailed from Newport News.

The Americans were signed here as horsemen. They were all white, and gave their homes as in various sections of the United States. Local agents of the Marina say cable advices reported the vessel leaving Glasgow for Newport News on Oct. 24 in ballast.
