OFFICIAL REPORTS TELL OF FURTHER GAINS FOR ALLIES

London, Aug. 23.—A further advance by the British in the region of Thiepval is recorded in the British official communication issued this evening, which says that 200 yards of a German trench has been captured there. The silencing of German artillery at three different points is also told of. The statement says:

"South of Thiepval, in the Somme region, we gained a further 200 yards of a German trench, which has strengthened our line and improved our position. The enemy's artillery, which had been showing much activity, was silenced in three different areas by the counter-battery work of our heavy guns, which appeared to be very effective."

"When the weather cleared yesterday evening, enemy aircraft, which had displayed unwonted enterprise, were engaged in large numbers with most satisfactory results. At least four hostile machines were destroyed and many others damaged. We suffered no casualties."

French Take Prisoners.
Paris, Aug. 24.—The official communication issued by the War Office this evening says:

"North and south of the Somme, artillery fighting continued all day, being particularly severe in the sectors of Belloy and Estrees."

"On the right bank of the Meuse an attack, brilliantly conducted by our

troops against German positions between Fleury and the Thiaumont work, resulted in an appreciable advance for us. We also took 200 prisoners."

"Adjutant Dorme brought down his sixth aeroplane, which fell northwest of Chaulnes. Another enemy aeroplane was felled near Roye."

No Overtures for Peace.

London, Aug. 23.—No peace overtures have been made to Great Britain, declared Lord Robert Cecil, Minister of War Trade, and Parliamentary Under-secretary for foreign affairs, in the House of Commons today.

Lord Robert's statement was made in response to a question by Sir Jas. Henry Daisiel, Liberal member for Kirkcaldyburgh, in regard to "peace rumors" and the situation in the Balkans.

"No overtures have been made for peace," said Lord Robert. "There is only one way in which overtures for peace could be made, and that is from an enemy to the government of this country, but no communications of the kind have been received."

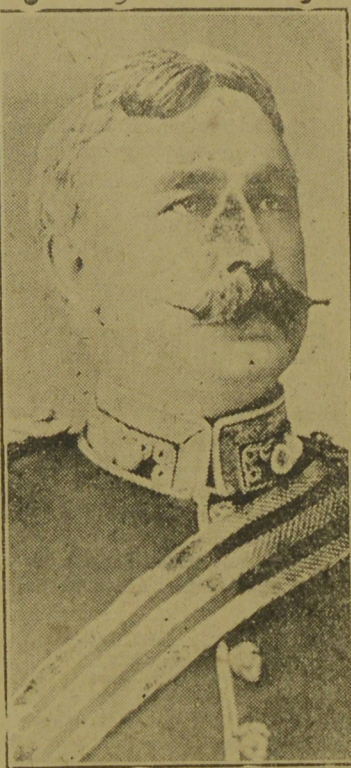
COL. H. H. McLEAN, M. P. HAS BEEN PROMOTED

OPPOSITION CONVENTION TO BE HELD AUG. 30.

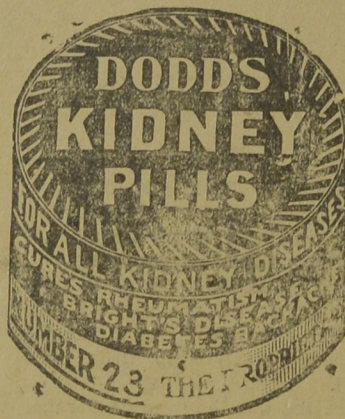

Public Schools Notice.

FOR the special benefit of pupils who are unable to complete the common school course, the Trustees will open a pre-vocational department in the York Street School building. Applicants for admission to this department will file their names with the Secretary and obtain an admission certificate.

In accordance with the Compulsory Schools Act, all children from six to fourteen years of age must be in attendance at school. In every case the reason for non-attendance must be given to the Board of School Trustees by the parent or guardian of the child.

In pursuance of Sec. 73 of the Schools Act, the Secretary is required in every case to demand a physician's certificate or other evidence of recent successful vaccination before a permit may be issued.

All the schools will be re-opened on Monday, 28th inst., at 9 o'clock, a.m., and permits may be obtained at the office on York Street during the previous week. Applicants for admission to the Model School, whose names have been registered, will apply for permits on Friday, 25th inst.
