SALE OF DANISH WEST INDIES TO U. S.

London, Aug. 2.—Messages received here today from Copenhagen say the Danish authorities have not confirmed the reports of the sale of the Danish West Indies to the United States. The newspaper Politiken says the Rigsraad will hold a secret session on Friday, when the government will answer questions on the subject.

An official announcement was made at Washington on July 25th that the purchase of the Danish West Indies by the United States from Denmark for \$25,000,000 had virtually been completed.

WESTERN CROPS DAMAGED BY HAIL

Winnipeg, Aug. 3.—A number of despatches have been received telling of severe damage at different points in Saskatchewan yesterday from hail. A hail storm of unusual severity struck the district south of Saskatoon and a number of farmers suffered heavy losses.

Hail and wind damaged several thousand acres of crop in Nokomis district.

MRS. CHAMBERLAIN WEDS AGAIN

London, Aug. 3.—Mrs. Joseph Chamberlain, widow of the late British statesman, and the Rev. William Hartley Carnegie, rector of St. Margaret's, and Canon of Westminster, were married at Westminster Abbey at 8 o'clock this morning. The ceremony was very simple and quiet.

Mrs. Chamberlain before her first marriage was Miss Mary Endicott, of Massachusetts.

SECOND ANNIVERSARY OF DECLARATION OF WAR

Intercession Service at Cathedral To-morrow Morning—Public Meeting Also.

The second anniversary of the declaration of war will be observed to-morrow by a public service of intercession on behalf of the naval and military forces of the Allies. This will be at Christchurch Cathedral, beginning at 11 a.m. Very Rev. Dean Neales will preach the service. A public meeting will be held in the City Opera House beginning at 2 p.m. Representatives of the municipal bodies will be present. Ways and means of meeting the deficit in the Patriotic Fund will be discussed. The resolution prepared by His Honor the Lieutenant Governor, concerning the war, will be presented to the meeting.

GEORGE RIDOUT TO BE CHIEF OF POLICE

George R. Rideout, of Moncton, it is understood, has been appointed Chief of Police of Fredericton. When Mr. Rideout was in Fredericton some time ago his appointment was forecasted by the Mail. The Police Commission has made no formal announcement of his appointment, but it has been expected at any time during the past forty-eight hours. He was formerly a patrolman on the Fredericton police force.

NEW FORESTRY UNIT.

It is understood that the two new forestry battalions now being raised in Canada, the 238th and 246th, will provide all the lumbermen that will be needed for the operations in the old country.

The 224th, in which there are many New Brunswick lumbermen, is doing most of its work in the north of Scotland, cutting Scotch pine. The new battalions are expected to go over to France.
