## CUMMINGS GOES TO THE PENITENTIARY

Tough Colored Citizen Convicted on The Charge of Resisting Arrest At Chipman.

At the regular term of the Queens County Court this week, Wilfrid Cummings, a negro, belonging to Halifax, was convicted on the charge of resisting arrest and was sentenced by Judge Wilson to two years in the Dorchester penitentiary. On the second count in the indictment, that of assault with intent to cause grievous bodily harm, the jury disagreed.

Mr. John H. Duan appeared for the crown and Mr. C. D. Richards, of this city, was assigned by the court to conduct the defence.

Cummings, who hails from Halifax, bears a bad reputation. He conducted a clothes cleaning joint at Gagetown for a time, and getting into trouble with the authorities, removed to Chipman. Here he got into more trouble and was arrested for debt. He made things lively for the constables, and it took four men to land him in the cooler. The law-abiding people of Queens county are hopeful that he will seek some new field on the completion of his sojourn at Dorchester.

## HUN DESTROYERS IN A RAID

LONDON, Oct. 27.—Ten German torpedo boat destroyers attempted to raid the British cross-channel transport service last night, but the attempt failed, says an official statement issued by the British Admiralty. Two of the German destroyers were sunk and the others were driven off. The German destroyers succeeded in sinking one empty transport, the Queen. All the members of her crew were saved.

One British torpedo boat destroyer, the Flirt, is missing, the British statement adds, and another destroyer, the Nubian, was disabled by a torpedo and ran aground. Nine members of the crew of the Flirt were saved.

The text of the Admiralty announcement follows:

"During the night the enemy attempted a raid with destroyers on our cross-channel transport service. The attempt failed. One empty transport, the Queen, was sunk. The whole of her crew were saved. Two of the enemy destroyers were sunk, and the rest were driven off.

### British Boat Missing.

"H. M. torpedo boat destroyer Flirt, Lieut. Richard P. Kellett, R. N., has not returned and it is feared she may be lost, but nine of the crew have been saved.

"H. M. torpedo boat destroyer Nubian, Commander Montague Bernard, R. N., was disabled by a torpedo and taken in tow, but owing to the bad weather the tow parted and she has gone aground.

## British Raid German Trenches

London, Oct. 25.—British troops last night raided the German trenches in the sector south of the river Ancre, in Northern France, says the official report issued by the War Office today. This front a heavy rain fell during the night.

The sons are Chas. Knorr, of St. John, John of Oromocto, and George, of Blissville. The daughters are Mrs. Herbert Baston, of St. John, Mrs. R. B. Smith, of Oromocto, and Mrs. Robert Charlton, of Montreal. The funeral will take place Saturday at 2.30 p.m., with service by Rev. Mr. Hamilton. Interment will be made at Blissville.

### Death in Gibson.

Mrs. Amelia Woodbury, wife of Mr. Austin Woodbury, passed away this morning at the home of Mr. Harry A. Fradsham, Gibson. The deceased was a daughter of the late Allan Hoban, of Marysville. Besides the husband, two sons, Sherman, of Boston, and Lowell, of Calais, and one daughter, Mrs. Garfield Jarvis, of Montreal, survive. The remains will be taken to Calais tonight by C. P. R. Rev. Thos. Marshall will conduct the service.

### The Case Adjourned.


