## LOCAL DREDGING EXPERTS FIGHTING IN THE COURTS

**Rev. J. B. Daggett, Secretary for Agriculture Defendant in Suit Brought by Col. P. A. Guthrie--Asked to Pay up a \$500 Note Given for Stock in a Dredging Co.**

Woodstock, Aug. 25.—The spoils of office and the spoils of contractors are spoiling the Tory party. There is a fresh division in the ranks at Fredericton. Rev. John B. Daggett, who is secretary for agriculture, and was recently in the limelight of an affidavit of Harry M. Blair in connection with carrying \$500 to one T. V. Monahan to pay on an election note, is now refusing to pay a good sized note which he gave to Percy A. Guthrie for stock in the St. John River Dredging and Construction Co.

It would seem by Mr. Daggett's statement of defence which has been filed and is now a public record, that he accuses Percy A. Guthrie of misrepresenting many things, and he also says that among some others H. F. McLeod, M. P., and Harry M. Blair got their stock for nothing. The agile young Tories gathered into this company in Fredericton as if to a feast soon as the Dominion Government changed. There were local members, members of the government, officials of the departments and prominent Tory henchmen, all in the ring, and the smart ones got the money; the others got left.

Rev. Mr. Daggett is refusing to pay, and by so doing will bring all his friends into court and make more noise even than his other transaction in which he and his minister, Mr. Murray, and Harry Blair and T. V. Monahan and the Guthrie election note figured.

As Rev. Mr. Daggett is being depended upon to come to the assistance of B. Frank Smith in his campaign, this further revelation of his financial activities since he has been in Fredericton will surprise those who knew him in Hartland before he was appointed deputy minister.

### Mr. Daggett's Defence.

This suit against Mr. Daggett is simply a result of the split up in the Tory party in York, and the determination of Colonel Guthrie to make those who owe him pay up. He has stated that while fighting in France many people whom he had endorsed for allowed their notes to go unpaid and they were charged to his account in the bank. Since his return he has been inviting many political associates to pay him, and it is evident Mr. Daggett is among the number.

came a summer in which the water was so high that little dredging could be done. Then other dredging companies demanded a share and were awarded part of the work.

Altogether, the local Tory dredgers were in a hard place. Finally Manager Johnston resigned and eventually returned to Nashwaaksis with a wealth of experience.

The other members of the company developed chronic grouches and started to get from under.

The most recent announcements are that Lieut. Col. H. F. McLeod, M. P., has obtained judgment for \$657 against the company, the Lieut. Col. P. A. Guthrie, M. P., is suing Rev. J. B. Daggett, Secretary of Agriculture, for \$500 on a note given for payment for stock, ex-Warden Harry A. Smith being concerned in the transaction, and that the Bank of Nova Scotia, thinking that it should get something out of the mess, has signed judgment against the company, which includes all the scrap-pers.
