
### CARL WEGNER DESCRIBES HORRORS ON SOMME FRONT

Rotterdam, Aug. 25, via London.—Carl Wegner, in the Kolnische Zeitung, describing the horrors to which the German troops are subjected on the Somme front by the French and British artillery fire, says that the Germans having been forced by the first sweep of the Somme offensive to give up their girdle of strongly built forts, are now holding to a line of positions consisting only of a chain of shell holes.

"What is to be seen now," he writes, "is only that which we have been able to create in haste, under the fearful bombardment of both the British and French."

"The men crouch immovable in these shell holes, with no cover from sun and rain, and not the slightest protection against the shells dropping like a torrent from straight above."

"The men lie in these pits in the most fearful confusion, with wounded who cannot be taken away until the approach of night, and with the dead, who cannot be buried at all. With the August heat the bodies begin to decay quickly."

### HENRY FORD MAKES CHANGES IN HIS 1917 CAR

(Boston Record.)

Henry Ford struck the right chord when he decided to make changes in his 1917 car. The new Ford is out and you've got to look at the Ford a second time to be convinced that it is a Ford.

The following are the principal changes to be noted:

The fitting of an entirely new radiator of black enamel which is of about the same width and height as the present one, although it has the appearance of being of slightly less thickness. The use of a sloping hood that eliminates any break where it adjoins the body. The addition of crowned fenders front and rear which conform to the curve of the wheels in most modern fashion.

The wheel base and body are not changed. The shape of the new radiator has no sharp or abrupt edges, the new shell having rounded edges where the side parts of the shell curve into the top portion, and the front edge is founded also.

Soldiers no longer departed for the front with songs and cheers on their lips, but in silence, he said.



#### Public Schools Notice.

FOR the special benefit of pupils who are unable to complete the common school course, the Trustees will open a pre-vocational department in the York Street School building. Applicants for admission to this department will file their names with the Secretary and obtain an admission certificate.

In accordance with the Compulsory Schools Act, all children from six to fourteen years of age must be in attendance at school. In every case the reason for non-attendance must be given to the Board of School Trustees by the parent or guardian of the child.

In pursuance of Sec. 73 of the Schools Act, the Secretary is required in every case to demand a physicians' certificate or other evidence of recent successful vaccination before a permit may be issued.

All the schools will be re-opened on Monday, 28th inst., at 9 o'clock, a.m., and permits may be obtained at the office on York street during the previous week. Applicants for admission to the Model School, whose names have been registered, will apply for permits on Friday, 25th inst.
