Russians Moving Toward Lemberg

Vienna, via London, Aug. 11.—“We have evacuated Stanislaw without fighting,” says the official statement issued from general headquarters today. The statement also admits the withdrawal of Austrian troops to new positions in the Stanislaw and Monasterzyska regions, owing to the Russian pressure.

Petrograd's Official Report.

Petrograd, Aug. 11.—Stanislaw, an important railway centre southeast of Lemberg, capital of Galicia, has been occupied by Russian troops. The capture is announced in the official statement of this evening. The Austrians retreated in the direction of Halicz.

The Russians have also made important successes in the Sereth region.

The capture of Stanislaw gives the Russians another gateway through which they can march toward Lemberg. Like Brody, Stanislaw is an important railway centre. It is 87 miles southeast of Lemberg and is situated between two forks of the Bystritsa river ten miles south of the Dniester.

Stanislaw before the war had a population of 33,000.

SAILORS ADRIFT THREE DAYS.

Crew of Vessel Bound from Halifax for England Picked Up at Sea.

Boston, Aug. 11.—After being adrift three days in small boats, Capt. Thos. Kyffin and the seven members of the crew of the schooner R. Bowers, abandoned in a gale off the Grand Banks, were brought here today by the British steamer Cape Finisterre. The men—in great distress—were picked up by the British steamer Homer City and transferred to the Cape Finisterre, inward bound from Glasgow.

Capt. Kyffin reported that the Bowers, bound from Halifax for a British port with pulp, began leaking during a storm and was battered about by the heavy seas for some hours before the crew took to the boats.

Intending Recruit Arrested.

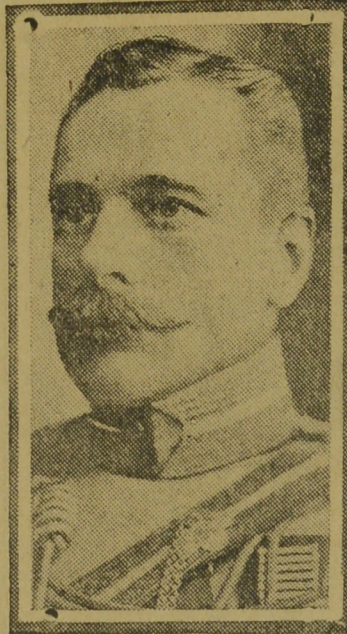

Ald. D. J. Shea went to Moncton this morning to attend the A. O. H. convention.

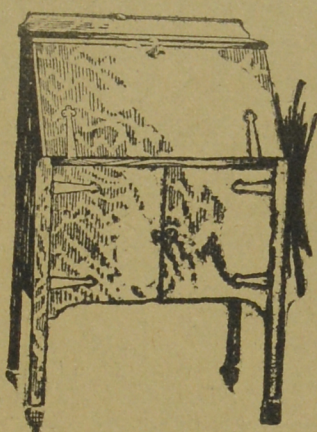

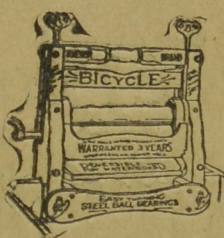
