SIGNS OF AN ELECTION.

Coming Events Cast Their Shadows Before in Carleton County.

(Woodstock Press.)

E. F. Smith, M.L.A., of East Florenceville, accompanied by Mr. Feeney, the provincial road builder, inspected the roads between Woodstock and Richmond on Monday, and when asked by a reporter, stated that a substantial expenditure will be made at once on the Houlton road, in view of making it a permanent highway.

Other roads in the parishes in this county will receive special attention immediately, Mr. Smith and Mr. White—the local members—having been urging this upon the government for some time.

PROGRESS OF THE RUSSIANS.

The Advance in Galicia Continues All Along the Line.

Petrograd, via London, Aug. 11.—The Russians are advancing on the Sereth River in Galicia, the War Office announced today. They have also entered the town of Monastyrzyska, northwest of Stanislaw.

Fighting is continuing in Monastyrzyska. The Russians have reached the Dniester south of Marianopol, which is eight miles southeast of the important town of Halicz. They have also advanced to the right bank of the Bystritsa river, a branch of the Dniester, which joins that river near Marianopol.

MAY ASK THAT
WRIT BE ISSUED
Opposition Candidates May Take
Advantage of Act Passed Last
Session.

(St. John Globe.)

There are rumors that the Opposition in the Provincial Legislature intends to ask the Clerk of the Crown in Chancery to issue writs for the six vacancies in the House. The reason for this rumor is found in gossip among the legal profession that section 173 of the Act passed last session makes such a demand legal. This section of the New Brunswick Elections Act reads:

"In case of a vacancy by death, resignation or otherwise of a member, or member-elect, the Clerk of the Crown in Chancery, upon being certified thereof in writing by two members or two members-elect, shall issue his writ for the election to fill such vacancy."

It is held by some lawyers who have read the section that if two members of the Legislature direct the attention of the Clerk of the Crown in Chancery (Mr. T. Carleton Allen) to this, that he will be compelled to issue writs for an election. The matter is causing considerable interest in political circles.

THE STEAMER ELAINE
IS NOT SUITABLE

Has No Accommodations for First-Class Passengers to Gaspé.

The steamer "Elaine" has arrived and has made a trip down the coast.

Those who have looked the boat over and who are competent to judge, say that she is not at all suitable for the route, even with extensive alterations.

After waiting three months, when it was expected all necessary alterations and improvements would be made to meet the conditions of travel on the proposed route, the boat arrived here with not a stateroom or other necessary improvements made, and looking so dirty and weather beaten that first class passengers would not care to take a trip in her, and it looks from all outward appearance as if the owners have come to the Bay Chaleur not to serve the public, and endeavor to encourage tourist traffic, but solely to make the necessary number of trips to earn a part of the subsidy offered.

The boat is too small to comfortably sail the Bay Chaleur, and while she may have been a useful boat on the St. John river route, we venture to predict that she will be a worse failure than the steamers which served the route in the past two or three years.

CONFESSED TO MURDER.

Jail Prisoner Admits Crime for Which Another Man is Under Sentence of Death.

Buffalo, N. Y., Aug. 11.—Sheriff Nichols of Cattaraugus, last night at Little Valley announced that a prisoner, Earl King, had confessed that he was guilty of the murder of Charles Phelps and his housekeeper Mary Wolcott at West Shelby on March 22, 1915.

For these murders Charles Steilow is under sentence of death, but his day of execution had recently been delayed.

King, who is fifty years of age, was arrested on Tuesday night at Pavilion by a private detective agency.

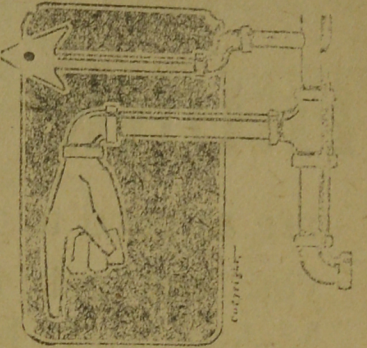

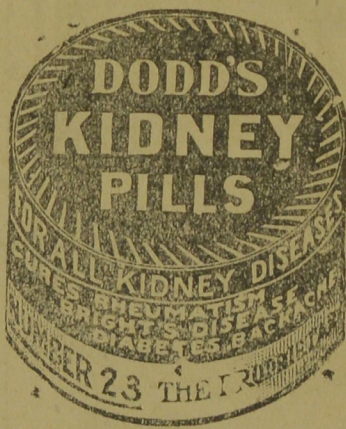
