PITCHER SALLEE IS  
SUSPENDED FOR TEARING

Suspension is Indefinite---  
Had Row with Manager  
Huggins of St. Louis  
Nationals.

New York, June 16—Harry Sallee, star pitcher of the St. Louis Nationals, was indefinitely suspended today as the result of an altercation with Manager Huggins last night. Sallee tore up his contract, during the argument, Huggins said, and left the city.

"Sallee has been dissatisfied for some time," Huggins said. "He has not broken training, however. There have been rumors that he would be purchased by the Giants and these reports added to his dissatisfaction. There was no foundation for the reports. There is no deal on in which Sallee is involved and he will not be sold or traded to any club."

Boston, Jan. 17—Joe Connelly, the mystic idol of Charlestown, added another K.O. to his record last night by stopping Young Brusso in five rounds in the feature bout at the Commercial A.C. Brusso gave Connelly a stiff argument up to the time that Connelly swung a right to his jaw, ending the contest.

In the semifinal between Joe Farren of East Boston, and Johnny Mack of Cambridge, the latter hit Farren low three times and the referee awarded the bout to Farren on a foul in the second round.

In the opening six-round bout Tony Vatin again defeated Red Kelly. Jim Kenny and Harry Ah Chung met in the eight-round bout and it was a hard-fought contest. Kenny was given the decision.

At the club next Friday night Bill Casey will meet Patsy DeLuca in one ten-round bout and Dave Powers will go against Yank O'Brien in another. Johnny Emery will box Dan McCormack in one-six round bout and Jim Farren and Dick Howard will meet in another.

HEWITT'S RECORD  
FOR HALF-MILE RUN  
STANDS SINCE 1868

Covered Distance in One  
Minute 53 1-2 Seconds  
--Now Seventy-Two  
Years Old--In Australia.

Frank S. Hewitt, whose professional world's record of 1m., 53 1/2 sec. for the half-mile has been on the books for nearly forty-five years, is still living in Australia. He was twenty-seven years old when he made the record and is therefore in his seventy-second year. Hewitt record of 438 for four hundred yards is also still on the books, though it was made as far back as 1868.

A. E. Bird, a great runner of Hewitt's time, died recently in Australia. He went to the Antipodes years ago with Hewitt, where he made a great record as a half-mile and mile runner.

HITTING RECORDS SHOW  
SPEAKER STILT AT TOP

Chicago, Ill., June 17—Terrific hitting by the Cubs in the past week put them in the lead in club batting in the National League, with .265, and gave them three places among the ten batters doing .300 or better.

Averages published here today which take in games played last Wednesday, show Jake Daubert of Brooklyn, still heads the list with .345. Max Gasey of Pittsburgh, has resumed his lead in stolen bases with eighteen but in most other departments the Cubs are ahead, Williams in home runs with seven and total bases with ninety-nine, Zimmerman in runs scored with thirty-three and Black in sacrifice hits with nineteen.

Only seven regulars are hitting better than .300 in the American League. Speaker still leads with .388 and is ahead in total bases with 108 and in runs scored with forty-three. The unusual sight of a catcher leading the league in stolen bases is shown, with Schalk of Chicago, setting the pace with fourteen, one ahead of such speedy men as Cobb, and Sisler. Graney of Cleveland, leads in home runs with four and Gandil of Cleveland, in sacrifice hits with sixteen. Detroit is ahead in the team hitting with .256.

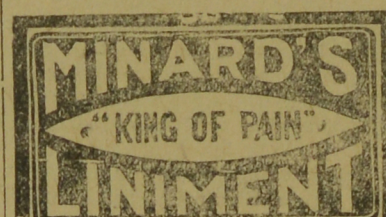

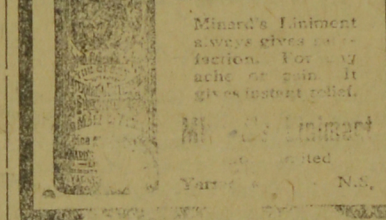

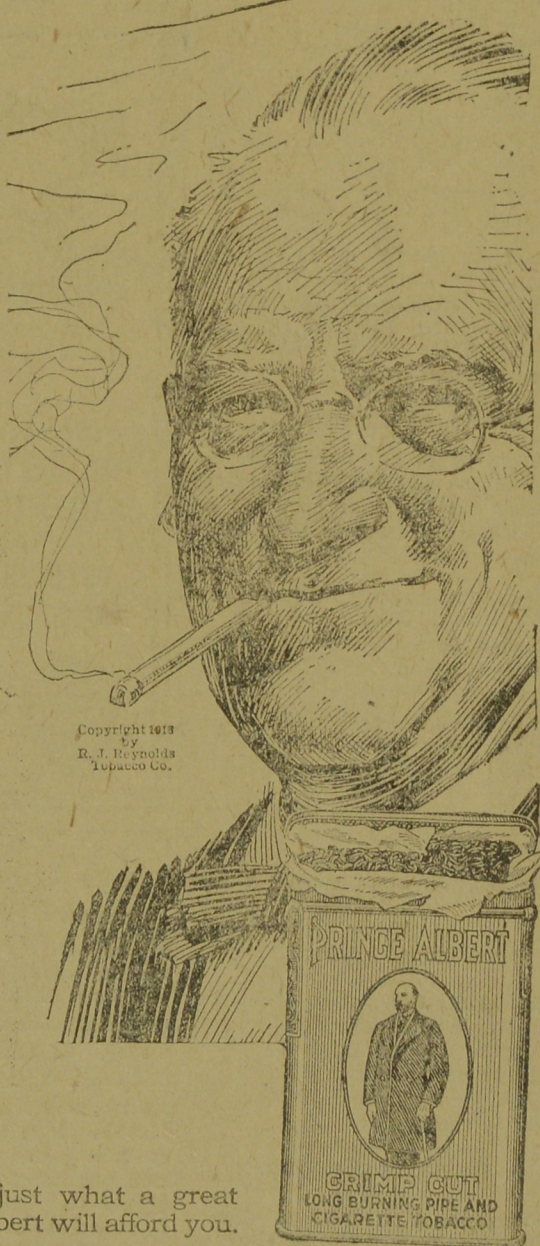
