

FOUR STEAMERS
HAD A CLOSE CALL

St. Johns, Nfld., Feb. 11.—After seeking this port as a refuge from a succession of North Atlantic gales, four steamers narrowly escaped disaster in the harbor last night.

During a furious storm, the steamer Muskogee, which arrived short of coal from Copenhagen for New York dragged her anchors and brought up on a shoal at the entrance to the harbor. The steamers Ontaneda, Copenhagen for Baltimore, Lochtay, Rotterdam for New York, and Baltimore, from Christiania for Boston, Philadelphia and Baltimore, also dragged their anchors and barely escaped going ashore. An effort to refloat the Muskogee will be made today.

BOSTON BRAVES
BUY ED KONETCHY

New York, Feb. 9.—A deal was closed here yesterday afternoon between the Boston Braves and Ed Konetchy of the Pittsburgh Federal League Club, disposing of Pitcher Elmer Knetzer, Frank Allen and First Baseman Ed Konetchy.

Knetzer and Allen jumped to the local club from the Brooklyn Nationals, while Konetchy hopped over to the Independents from the Pirates. The purchase price is said to be \$20,000.

The Boston Club assumes the Federal League contracts of the players Konetchy's is for \$8000 a year and runs for two years. Knetzer and Allen have contracts carrying through 1916.

The three men will report with the first squad at the Braves' training camp.

After closing the deal, Manager Stallings left for his home in Georgia, while President Haughton remained on the ground to close another important deal by which the Braves will get a first class catcher.

EXTENDS PLAYER LIMIT

President Barrow appointed C. T. Chapin and W. H. Draper as a committee to assist him in adjusting the Jersey City-Newark situation.

The player limit was increased from fifteen, exclusive of a manager, to seventeen, including the manager, for each club.

Following the action of the National League, it was decided that in future there shall be no appeal from the decision of President Barrow on protested games. The meeting adjourned subject to the call of the

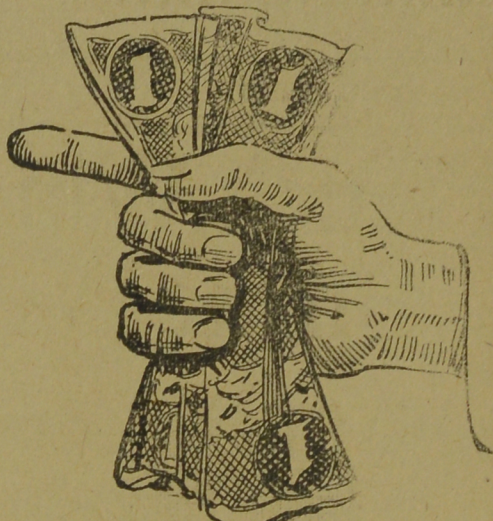

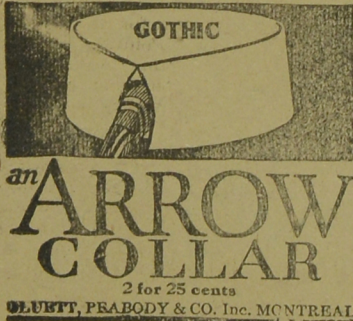
