DAUBERT AND TRIS SPEAKER LEADING BIG LEAGUE BATTERS

Percentage of Daubert is 384 and That of Speaker 398--Boston Nationals Best Club.

Chicago, May 20—Jake Daubert, Brooklyn's first baseman, is leading the batters of the National League, according to the averages published here today, and including games played last Wednesday.

His percentage is .384. Boston has taken first place in club batting with .372. The three leading National League hitters are: Daubert, Brooklyn, .384; Zimmerman, Chicago, .358; Robertson, New York, .357.

Tris Speaker, Cleveland, leads the American Leaguers in batting, with .395. Cobb is again doing better than .300. Detroit, with .261, leads in club batting. The leading hitters of the American League who have played a half or more of the games, are: Speaker, Cleveland, .398; Burz, Detroit, .364.

AMERICAN ASSOCIATION CHOSE TWENTY-MAN LIMIT

Chicago, May 19—American Association club owners, in a special meeting today, repealed the rule of February 21, 1915 imposing a player limit of sixteen men, and will be governed henceforth by the rule of the National agreement, which puts the limit for the Class AA clubs at twenty.
